WATERING AND MAINTENANCE

Watering Reminder: Help the Village preserve potable water supplies with good water conservation practices! The current watering restriction is Yellow. Condition Yellow shall allow the outside use of the Village's potable water supply for lawn watering only on alternate days (odd/even based on your address) between the hours of 6am-9am and 6pm-9pm. Current conditions are subject to change. Signs are posted throughout the Village displaying the color and water restriction conditions. Current conditions are also posted on the Village's Public Works water page at www.huntley.il.us.

Property Maintenance Reminder: Residential properties within the Village shall be maintained free from weeds and plant growth in excess of 8 inches. Complete information on these regulations can be found on the Village website at www.huntley.il.us.

ANNUAL MOSQUITO CONTROL

The Village of Huntley's annual mosquito control program is underway through the Village's mosquito abatement contractor, Clarke. Clarke provides services that prevent mosquito breeding and suppress mosquito populations, including those that carry mosquito-borne disease. Prior to registering any product, including the Duet product used by Clarke, the EPA evaluates the product thoroughly. Duet has passed rigorous tests required by the EPA and has been approved for public health mosquito control and registered for use by the U.S. EPA in 1995. Duet is applied at extremely low dosage rates – less than an ounce per acre - during the overnight hours. The spray (mist) dissipates quickly through the treatment area within 5 to 30 minutes, depending on weather conditions. Duet is applied in small droplets, which break down quickly in the environment. Since the product must hit a mosquito while it is in flight to have an effect, it is sprayed at night when mosquitoes are actively flying. Each summer, our Bike Patrol officers lead other cyclists on the Bike Huntley ride. This event takes participants over some of our many biking paths and through some of our beautiful parks. The entire ride is approximately 8.5 miles and will take about an hour for the average rider to complete. Registration is required for this event. EXTREME HEAT AWARENESS MONTH

July is Extreme Heat Awareness Month. Due to extreme summer heat and humidity, overheating is one of the biggest hazards at this time of year. Heat illnesses or injuries happen when the body is not able to cool itself. Although the body normally cools itself by sweating, during extreme heat, sweating may not be enough. High temperatures paired with significant humidity can lead to increased risks of heat cramps, heat illness, heat stroke, and heat exhaustion.

<u>Heat-related injuries and fatalities are preventable</u>. Here are some steps you can take to stay safe during extreme heat:

- Take breaks in the shade
- Drink plenty of water
- Avoid overexertion and strenuous outdoor activities
- Wear light-colored, loose-fitting clothing that covers the skin to prevent sunburn
- Use sunscreen
- Don't leave children or pets in a vehicle Look before you lock!
- Keep curtains and shades closed at home
- Take cool showers or baths
- Avoid using your oven
- If you don't have air conditioning, visit a cooling center, store, or mall
- Check on family members, seniors, and neighbors

The Huntley Cemetery was established in 1861 and is the resting place of the Village of Huntley's founding father, Thomas Stillwell Huntley (1807 - 1894) as well as many other early leaders of the Village of Huntley. Many service men and women who served our Country are also buried throughout the Cemetery. A Columbarium within the Cemetery provides a second option for a resting place in addition to the traditional interment burial. The Cemetery, owned and operated by the Village, is located at 11500 Dean Street (east side) and 11503 Dean Street (west side). It encompasses just over seven acres of property.
