CURBSIDE TREE BRANCH PICK UP

The Huntley Public Works and Engineering Department has scheduled its semi-annual curbside tree branch pickup for Village of Huntley residents.

Branch Pick Up Schedule:

Branches must be placed on the parkway the Sunday before collection begins in each area. Please stack branches along the curb line so that the trunks (larger end of branch) are all facing the same direction, either towards the roadway or with traffic. Branch collection crews will make only one pass in each neighborhood. Branches put out after crews have passed will not be collected. Crews will not go on private property to pick up the branches.

Residents that miss the curbside pickup can make arrangements with their waste hauler. In addition, a Saturday one time only drop off is scheduled for May 15 at Public Works (located on Donald Drive) from 8 am to 12 pm. Questions? FROM THE HUNTLEY POLICE DEPARTMENT <u>Don't Fall for a Gift Card Scam</u>



Gift cards are a convenient and popular present for our loved ones. Unfortunately, they have also become a popular way of scamming people out of their money. Please remember: gift cards are for gifts, not for payment.

Gift card scams have many variations. The scammers can hack email addresses and phone numbers to make it appear they are a government agency, a large company or even a friend or family member. Scammers may claim to be the IRS demanding back taxes, a law enforcement agency demanding bond, or a retailer demanding payment for an order. They will continue to change their tactics and use any means necessary to get your money. It can be hard to keep up with all the scams out there, but one important thing to remember is that gift cards cannot ever be used to pay bail, taxes or court fines.

If anyone contacts you asking for any kind of payment via gift card, you should immediately suspect it is a scam. Hang up the phone and contact the agency/company directly instead of purchasing gift cards. Additional information is available at www.consumer.ftc.gov/ articles/paying-scammers-gift-cards. FREEMAN ROAD PROJECT UPDATE (PROJECT PUMPKIN) The Village Board has approved the request by Venture One Acquisitions to annex and develop the property commonly known as the Stade Farm, 41W368 Freeman Road (across from the former outlet center). The property is currently located in unincorporated Kane County. Based on the approval received at the March 11 Village Board Meeting, the 261 acre property will be annexed to the Village of Huntley. Venture One plans to immediately develop the southern 152 acres with a distribution center totaling approximately 629,186 square feet. While the developer has not yet officially identified the end user (tenant) for Lot 1, Venture One anticipates the new business will create up to 1,000 jobs, including both warehouse and office positions. The remaining land will be developed at a future date.
