Do You Need a Building Permit?

It's that time of year! If you're doing home improvement projects, there's a good chance you will need a building permit. Building permits and inspections are required for the Village's Building and Code Enforcement Division to ensure that each project meets the minimum requirements of the adopted building, electric and plumbing codes. The way we do this is through plan review and inspections. These processes provide the means for the Village to protect the public by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction.

Below is a list of some of the more common projects that require a building permit. This is not an all inclusive list. Additions; Air Conditioners*; Basement Remodeling / Finishing; Decks; Demolitions; Driveways and Driveway Ribbons; Electrical System Installations; Electrical Service Updates; Fences*; Furnaces*; Hot Water Heaters*; Irrigation System Installations; New Buildings; Patios*; Plumbing Systems; Ponds (24" deep and over); Re-roofing*; Remodeling; Second water meters*; Sewer Repair/Clean Out; Sheds; Service walks*; Sun Rooms / Three Season Rooms; Swimming Pools; Spas & Hot Tubs.

*Generally, these permits may be issued over the counter while you wait. For example, exterior structures on corner lots require additional review time and are not available over the counter.

Property Maintenance Reminders

<u>Grass & Weeds</u> - All premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growth in excess of eight (8) inches. All noxious weeds shall be prohibited. (See complete info online.)

Garbage Cans - All rubbish, garbage and yard waste including any and all garbage, recycling and yard waste containers shall be kept out of sight in the interior of the garage or behind a fence or landscape screen so as to be obscured from the front of the residence until permitted time to place it at the curb for pick-up. No garbage collection containers shall be placed curbside sooner than 6:00 p.m. of the day preceding the scheduled garbage pick-up collection day and shall be removed from the curbside no later than 9 pm on the collection day. (See complete info online.)

<u>Property Condition</u> - All exterior surfaces shall be maintained in good condition. Exterior wood surfaces shall be protected from the elements and decay by painting or other protective covering or treatment. Peeling, flaking and chipped paint shall be eliminated and surfaces repainted. (See complete info online.)

Addresses - Buildings and residences shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches (102 mm) in height with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch (12.7 mm).

Keep Young Drivers Safe

Car crashes are the number one killer of teens in the United States and a leading cause of death in countries around the world. According to NHTSA statistics, May and July are two of the deadliest months for youth on the roads.



A recent survey was taken which revealed 94 percent of accidents were caused by the driver. Vehicles, environment, and unknown critical reasons make up the remaining 6 percent. This means a majority of accidents can be limited and even prevented. An important way to do this is to have regular conversations with the teens in your life about the dangers they need to mitigate while driving.

Give constant reminders that wearing a seatbelt is a quick and simple step for a safer ride. Adults should note that modeling this behavior is even more effective than just talking about it.

Let your teen know that social media can wait and their cell phone will still be with them at the end of their travels. Remember that teens are new drivers and limiting unnecessary distractions in the car can aide them in developing their skills. This includes knowing who is in the car with your teen. Be familiar with Illinois Graduated Driver's License laws, as new drivers are restricted to the amount of passengers that can be in the car with them.

And as always - get there safe, not fast.
