2021 Annual Operating and Capital Budget Approved

In accordance with Illinois State Statute and direction received from the Village Board of Trustees, the 2021 Annual Operating and Capital Budget was approved on December 10. Through the budget preparation and review process, operational and capital projects goals were identified for completion in 2021. Goals were approved in support of the mission, vision and values statement of the 2016-2020 Strategic Plan. The 2021 Fiscal Year (FY21) Operating and Capital Budget totals \$29,412,564 in expenditures for all funds. Major projects for 2021 include:

- \$2,429,000 Annual Street Improvement Program that will provide for roadway resurfacing in the Covington Subdivision (\$2,114,000) and pavement patching, crack sealing, seal coating and pavement marking at various locations throughout the Village, most notably in Sun City Neighborhood 11
- \$2,100,000 in water main replacement work on IL Route 47 between Main Street and Mill Street; Mill Street from IL Route 47 to Dean Street; and Dean Street from Mill Street south to Martin Street
- \$1,500,000 in the Downtown TIF Fund for the construction of stormwater improvements near Church Street and Mill Street

- \$200,000 for repair of the Freeman Road culvert east of the Weber Global Distribution Center
- \$170,000 for partial Phase II Engineering for realignment and widening of Kreutzer Road, with a three-lane cross section, from Walmart east to Haligus Road (6,500 feet), including realignment at the railroad crossing, box culvert improvements and a multiuse path to improve traffic flow and provide an off-road pathway for pedestrian traffic
- \$491,200 for the replacement of police vehicles, public works vehicles and equipment, and computers and network components

In accordance with Village financial and budget policies, the proposed budget for the General Operating Fund is balanced with \$12,938,389 in revenues and expenditures.

Christmas Tree Disposal & Recycling

Huntley Park District Tree Recycling: Bring your tree to Sun Valley Farm at Betsey Warrington Park (12201 West Main Street) by January 31, free of tinsel and decorations. The trees will be used as mulch in our beautiful parks. There is no charge for this service.

MDC Environmental Services: For all residential areas in the Village, excluding Sun City and apartments, MDC will pick up discarded trees through the month of January. Simply place your tree at the curb. Trees larger than 10 feet tall mustbe cut in half. Please note that trees will not be recycled and will be taken to the landfill. Tinsel and decorations need not be removed. There is no charge for this service.

Waste Management: In Sun City, Waste Management provides pick-up of Christmas trees during the month of January. Tinsel and decorations need not be removed as these trees will be discarded in the landfill with other waste. Trees may be a maximum of 6 feet tall. There is no charge for this service.
