

Amazon construction is now underway on Freeman Road

Over the past months, the Plan Commission, Village Board and staff worked on a project with Venture One Acquisitions to annex and develop the property commonly known as the Stade Farm, 41W368 Freeman Road (east of Route 47 and across from the former outlet center). On March 11, the Village Board Meeting approved the zoning request as well as the request to annex the 261 acre property to the Village of Huntley. Venture One has begun site work on the southern 152 acres and will develop a distribution center totaling approximately 630,000 square feet. Amazon has signed a lease with Venture One and will be operating a Receive Center on the site. Amazon expects to create up to 1,000 jobs, including both warehouse and office positions. Employees at the Amazon Receive Center will support customer fulfillment by receiving large orders of inventory and redistributing products to fulfillment centers across the company's operations network. The investment in the Village is approximately \$100 million. The remaining land will be developed at a later date by a user to be determined in the future.

"We welcome and celebrate Amazon's decision to locate and invest in Huntley," said Mayor Charles Sass. "This project is in line with the Village's strategic vision to offer a wide range of employment centers, and we are confident that the projected 1,000 new jobs will benefit our community and the region as a whole. A project of this magnitude will be a catalyst for future growth and will assist in the Village's ongoing efforts to attract and promote new business development. We are excited to see what lies ahead as we welcome Amazon to Huntley."

FROM THE HUNTLEY POLICE DEPARTMENT - MAY IS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH -



Approximately 1 in 5 adults in the U.S. (46.6 million people) experiences mental illness in a given year but less than half get any treatment. Many of the police calls for service involve a mental health component. Huntley Police Department contracts a social services professional so officers can make a referral for residents to get additional help and resources after the law enforcement interaction is complete. We also have a number of policies and regular training on mental health, with the goal of providing the best service and meeting the needs of the entire community while maintaining a safe and friendly village.
