WINTER WEATHER IS JUST AROUND THE CORNER

The Village Public Works team clears snow on approximately 132 centerline miles of roadway and 173 cul-de-sacs or eyebrows. Please help keep the roads free of snow and ice as much as possible by following some simple guidelines.

Parking: On-street parking is currently prohibited between the hours of 2am through 6am and at any time within 8 hours after a snowfall of 2 inches or more has occurred.

Driveways: Depositing snow from driveways and walks into the street is prohibited by Village ordinance and creates a traffic hazard by leaving windrows or piles of snow in travel lanes. When clearing driveway aprons, property owners are encouraged to deposit snow in the parkway to the right side of the driveway (as you face the street) and as far away from the curb-line as possible. This will limit the amount of snow that the Village plow deposits into driveways as the streets are cleared.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL & RECYCLING

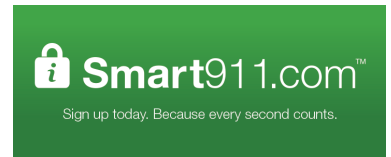
Huntley Park District Tree Recycling: Bring your tree to Sun Valley Farm at Betsey Warrington Park (12201 West Main Street) between December 26 and January 31, free of tinsel and decorations. The trees will be used as mulch in our beautiful parks. There is no charge for this service.

MDC Environmental Services: For all residential areas in the Village, excluding Sun City and apartments, MDC will pick up discarded trees through the month of January beginning on Monday, January 3. Simply place your tree at the curb. Trees larger than 10 feet tall must be cut in half. Please note that trees will not be recycled and will be taken to the landfill. Tinsel and decorations need not be removed. There is no charge for this service.

Waste Management: In Sun City, Waste Management provides pick-up of Christmas trees during the month of January. Tinsel and decorations need not be removed as these trees will be discarded in the landfill with other waste. Trees may be a maximum of 6 feet tall. There is no charge for this service.

SMART911 AVAILABLE TO ALL RESIDENTS

We encourage our residents to consider enrollment in Smart911, a free service that allows individuals to provide vital personal and medical information about themselves and family members, via a self-registration portal. Registration of your Smart911 Safety Profile is free, private and secure. Your Smart911 Safety Profile is only available to the 9-1-1 center when a 9-1-1 call is placed from your registered phone number. Smart911 is a national service meaning your Smart911 Safety Profile travels with you and is visible to any participating 9-1-1 centers nationwide.



With Smart911, you can provide 9-1-1 call takers and first responders critical information you want them to know in any kind of emergency. Every household has different needs, and Smart911 allows you to customize your Safety Profile to your household. Additional information can help responders better understand who may be in need of assistance, where they are located, and gauge their response accordingly. You can provide as much or as little information as you like.

Safety Profiles can include people living in your household; phone numbers associated with your family; pets, service animals, and livestock; medical conditions and allergies; medications and medical equipment; property details, layout, and utility information; vehicle descriptions; emergency contacts.

Amazon Receive Center is well underway with expected construction completion in Summer of 2022.

HUNTLEY POLICE DEPARTMENT OFFERS WOMEN'S SAFETY SERIES

The Huntley Police Department is proud to present a 3-week Women's Safety Series that addresses the unique safety challenges that women face in today's environment. The series is free and open to any woman who is 18 years of age or older (due to sensitive material) and a resident of Huntley.

This event will cover topics such as domestic and dating violence, rideshare safety, calling 911, social setting safety, social media, online dating, stalking, sexual assaults, grooming, sex trafficking and defensive tactics.

The class will meet the three consecutive Wednesdays of January 12, 19 and 26, from 6 to 9 pm in the Village of Huntley Municipal Center Board Room. Registrants should plan to attend all three of the sessions.
