UNTLEY CEMETERY MAINTENAN

Please remove all gravesite decorations from your loved ones gravesite area prior to October 29. Clean up and seasonal maintenance will take place beginning Monday, November 1 in the Huntley Cemetery. Decorations that remain in place after November 1 will be removed by the Village.

Winter decorations may be placed on or in line with headstones starting November 15 and must not cause an obstruction for maintenance. Winter decorations must be removed by March 15 for spring clean up maintenance taking place the first week in April 2022.

Decorations on and around gravesites have become excessive and many are in violation of the Village of Huntley Code of Ordinances regarding Cemetery and Columbarium rules.

WE CAN ALL HELP TO PROTECT HUNTLEY'S WATER RESOURCES

Polluted stormwater runoff may have adverse effects on plants, fish, animals, and people. Stormwater runoff occurs when precipitation from rain or snowmelt flows over the ground. Impervious surfaces like driveways, sidewalks and streets prevent stormwater from naturally soaking into the ground. Stormwater can pick up debris, chemicals, dirt and other pollutants and flow into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream, river, wetland or coastal water. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies used for swimming, fishing and providing drinking water. HUNTLEY POLICE TAKE A STAND AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

It is estimated that 35% of women and 29% of men have been victims of some form of physical violence by an intimate partner. Domestic violence isn't just physical - it can be emotional, verbal or financial. Domestic violence can affect anyone, regardless of age, race, gender, ethnicity or social/economic status. If you or someone you know is affected by domestic violence, here are some things to consider:

Always call 9-1-1 if you feel unsafe. You do not need to wait until physical abuse occurs to call the police. A law enforcement presence can help de-escalate the situation and officers can recommend resources for both the victim and perpetrator that may help break the cycle of domestic violence in the relationship. If that is not an option, the police can help you to leave the situation and find a safe place.

Create a personalized safety plan for yourself and your family. Practice multiple ways to leave the house, have necessary items ready to go, make a plan for your kids and pets, and know who you can trust to help you. The police or an advocate can help you create a detailed plan. Document the abuse by keeping a journal, filing police reports, saving emails/texts/social media posts, taking pictures of injuries/ damage caused by the abuser. Documentation will also help if you consider obtaining an **order of protection**, which can restrict access to the victim, residences and other family members (including children). Turning Point has advocates that can help you through this legal process. There are many resources available for those affected by domestic violence. We can help you find the appropriate resources, beyond law

enforcement remedies, to help your family physically, medically and emotionally. Resources are also available for children of domestic violence survivors. Children who witness domestic violence are more likely to repeat the cycle in their adult relationships. Early intervention can help break this cycle.

Most importantly, know that you are not alone and help is here. The men and women of the Huntley Police Department are dedicated to take a stand for you. Please reach out to us or another agency so we can assist you and your family.

Call4Calm Text Line is a text line created by the state as a direct response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Text TALK to 552020 (or HABLAR for Spanish), you will get a text back asking for the town where you live, followed by a call back from a local counselor.
