Electronics Recycling *Municipal Complex (9am-noon OR until dumpsters are full)* - Only residential electronics accepted, see <u>www.huntley.il.us</u> for accepted items. Due to space limitations only 1 TV or 1 computer monitor will be accepted per vehicle.

Paper & Document Destruction *Municipal Complex (9am-noon OR until truck is full)* - AMS Store and Shred will accept documents for destruction. No more than 2 banker boxes (or equivalent) per household.

Printer Cartridge Recycling *Municipal Complex* - Empty printer ink cartridges will be sent to a recycling center in exchange for a donation for local charity events. Thank you to the Fox River Valley Chapter DAR for coordinating these efforts.

Lions Club Eyeglass Collection *Municipal Complex* - Glasses will be donated to low and middle income communities worldwide.

Gently Used Book Drive *Municipal Complex* - Bring your gently used books for donation to non-profit organizations. No encyclopedias please.

CURBSIDE TREE BRANCH PICK UP

The Huntley Public Works and Engineering Department has scheduled the semiannual curbside tree branch pickup for Village of Huntley residents.

Homes North of Kreutzer/Sass Parkway: Week of May 2 Homes in Sun City: Week of May 9

Branches must be placed on the parkway the Sunday before collection begins in each area. Please stack branches along the curb line so that the trunks (larger end of branch) are all facing the same direction, either towards the roadway or with traffic. Branch collection crews will make only one pass in each neighborhood. Branches put out after crews have passed will not be collected. Crews will not go on private property to pick up the branches.

Residents that miss the curbside pickup can make arrangements with their waste hauler. In addition, a one-time only drop off is scheduled for Saturday, May 14 at Public Works (located on Donald Drive) from 8am to 12pm. FROM THE HUNTLEY POLICE DEPARTMENT - APRIL IS CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH -



April is Child Abuse Prevention Month. National Child Abuse Prevention Month recognizes the importance of families and communities working together to strengthen families to prevent child abuse and neglect. Through this collaboration, prevention services and supports help protect children and produce thriving families. If you or someone you know needs additional parenting support, please reach out to the United Way by calling 2-1-1 or visiting <u>www.211.org</u> to be directed to the appropriate local resources. If you suspect a child is being abused, please do not hesitate to call your local Police Department.

In honor of Child Abuse Prevention Month, the Child Advocacy Center of McHenry County (CAC) is hosting a supply drive. We are asking the Huntley community to help us support the CAC with these much-needed items: loungewear for children (new with tags), throw blankets, USB flash drives, small packs of diapers and wipes, office supplies (copy paper, sharpies, lined notepads), small containers of Play-Doh, gift cards, adult coloring books and Crayola markers, tote bags/backpacks (new with tags), travel size toiletry items, easel size paper pads, Squishmallows, electrical power strips and extension cords. Donations can be placed in the box in the Police Department lobby (10911 Main Street) through the end of April.
