WATERING AND MAINTENANCE

Watering Reminder: Help the Village preserve potable water supplies with good water conservation practices! The current watering restriction is Yellow. Condition Yellow shall allow the outside use of the Village's potable water supply for lawn watering only on alternate days (odd/even based on your address) between the hours of 6am-9am and 6pm-9pm. Current conditions are subject to change. Signs are posted throughout the Village displaying the color and water restriction conditions. Current conditions are also posted on the Village's Public Works water page at www.huntlev.il.us.

Property Maintenance Reminder: Residential properties within the Village shall be maintained free from weeds and plant growth in excess of 8 inches. Complete information on these regulations can be found on the Village website at **www.huntley.il.us**.

WATER EFFICIENCY OUTDOORS

Do you consider yourself efficient when using water outdoors? Water efficiency is the smart use of water resources by practicing water saving measures. By following a few techniques and taking simple steps, we can help ensure reliable water supplies today and for future generations. Here are a few things to consider:

- Adjust sprinklers so they are not spraying water on paved surfaces. If a sprinkler system is used, make sure it is properly setup and maintained.
- Water only when needed, or soak areas once a week, rather than on a schedule. Tip: If the grass springs back when you step on it, there is no need to water.
- If watering with a hose, make sure it has a shut-off nozzle.
- Sweep outdoor surfaces with a broom instead of using a hose.

<u>FROM THE HUNTLEY POLICE DEPARTMENT - HELP PREVENT MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT</u>

The month of July marks National Vehicle Theft Prevention Month. In 2020 alone, more than three quarters of a million vehicles were stolen in the United States, costing vehicle owners more than \$7 billion:

- Passenger cars made up more than 74% of all stolen motor vehicles
- Only 56.4% of all stolen motor vehicles were recovered
- There were 804,400 motor vehicles stolen - this is an 11.8% increase from 2019
- A motor vehicle was stolen every 39 seconds

As a driver, you can take steps to keep

your vehicle and belongings safe. Here are a few simple ways you can help to prevent motor vehicle theft:

- · Park in well-lit areas
- Close and lock all windows and doors when you park
- Hide or remove valuables from the vehicle
- Do not leave your keys in your vehicle
- Do not leave the area while your vehicle is running

We also recommend all residents practice the 9PM Routine – making a habit of securing your house, vehicle and belongings every night at 9. Remove all valuables from your

vehicles and lock it up, ensuring that you do not leave the keys/fob and garage door opener in the vehicle; close and secure your garage door; and check that your house doors and windows are locked.

Officers conducting neighborhood patrols look for open doors and unsecured vehicles at night. They will try to contact the homeowner to rectify the situation or will leave a courtesy

notice to remind them of the risk of unsecured property. For more information on motor vehicle theft prevention, visit NHTSA.gov/theft.
