CONSTRUCTION SEASON WRAPS UP

The Village of Huntley would like to extend a sincere thank you to our residents. We appreciate your patience and cooperation during road construction this season! In 2022, an investment of approximately \$3.4 million was made to resurface nearly 9 miles of roadway and over 1 mile of multi-use paths (this does not include the Algonquin Road work which is under McHenry County jurisdiction).

CURBSIDE TREE BRANCH PICKUP

The semi-annual curbside tree branch pickup for Village of Huntley residents is scheduled to be completed by the Public Works and Engineering Department as follows:

Homes N. of Kreutzer Rd: Week of Sept. 19 Homes in Sun City: Week of Sept. 26

- Branches must be placed on the parkway the Sunday before collection begins in each area.
- Please stack branches along the curb line so that the trunks (larger end of branch) are all facing the same direction, either towards the roadway or with traffic.
- Branch collection crews will make only one pass in each neighborhood.
- Branches put out after crews have passed will not be collected.
- Crews will not go on private property to pick up the branches.

Residents that miss the curbside pickup can make arrangements with their waste hauler or landscaping service. In addition, a one-time only drop off is scheduled for Saturday, October 2, at the Public Works facility (located on Donald Drive) from 8am-12pm.

HUNTLEY CEMETERY MAINTENANCE

Clean up and seasonal maintenance will begin Tuesday, November 1 in the Huntley Cemetery. Please remove all gravesite decorations, including solar lights, from your loved one's gravesite area prior to October 31.

Decorations that remain in place after October 31 will be removed by the Village. Shepherd hooks may remain by the headstone if used for a winter decoration.

Winter decorations may be placed on or in line with headstones starting November 15 but must not cause an obstruction for maintenance or they will be removed. Winter decorations are to be removed prior to the spring clean up in April 2023.

CROSSWALK SAFETY REMINDERS

Please stop for pedestrians in crosswalks as they travel throughout the village. Not only is it the law, it is the right thing to do! Be reminded that drivers and pedestrians alike are responsible for traffic safety. Drivers should always be prepared to yield the right-of-way and should not drive unnecessarily close to pedestrians. A driver must come to a complete stop (and yield):

- When a pedestrian is in a marked crosswalk.
- When a pedestrian is in an unmarked crosswalk on the driver's side of the roadway and there are no traffic control signals.
- When a pedestrian is leaving or entering a street or highway from an alley, building, private road or driveway.
- When a pedestrian is entering an intersection with a flashing yellow arrow.

- When making a turn at any intersection.
- When making a lawful turn on a red light after coming to a complete stop.
- After coming to a complete stop at a stop sign or flashing red signal at an intersection.
- When a pedestrian enters a crosswalk before the traffic light changed.
- When a pedestrian is walking with a green light, to a walking person symbol or a walk signal.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY EVALUATION


The Village recently completed a Pedestrian Safety Evaluation of pedestrian crossings at various locations throughout the Village to improve crossing safety. The first location to be considered for potential construction in 2023 will be the north intersection of Del Webb Boulevard and Cold Springs Drive, with the addition of a pedestrian refuge island and rapid reflective flash beacon (RRFB). The RRFB would provide warning to motorists of a pedestrian crossing the street while the refuge island would provide a midcrossing landing and narrowing of lane widths at the island creating a traffic calming effect. Additional locations for improvements will be reviewed in the future.

Don't forget to consider the unique needs each person or pet may have in case you have to evacuate quickly. Update your kits and supplies based on recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control.
- 3. **Low-Cost**, **No-Cost Preparedness:** Natural disasters don't wait for a convenient time. Preparing for them shouldn't wait either. Start today by signing up for alerts, safe-guarding important documents, and taking other low cost and no cost preparedness actions to lessen the impact of disasters and emergencies for you and your family.
- 4. **Teach Youth About Preparedness:** Talk to your kids about preparing for emergencies and what to do in case you are separated. Reassure them by providing information about how they can get involved.
