WATER EFFICIENCY OUTDOORS

Do you consider yourself efficient when using water outdoors? Water efficiency is the smart use of water resources by practicing water saving measures. By following a few techniques and taking simple steps, we can help ensure reliable water supplies today and for future generations. Here are a few things to consider:

- Adjust sprinklers so they are not spraying water on paved surfaces. If a sprinkler system is used, make sure it is properly set-up and maintained
- Water only when needed, or soak areas once a week, rather than on a schedule. Tip: If the grass springs back when you step on it, there is no need to water.
- If watering with a hose, make sure it has a shut-off nozzle.
- Sweep outdoor surfaces with a broom instead of using a hose.
- Water early! When temperatures are high, water can easily evaporate during the day. Beat the heat and water early in the morning.
- Reuse the water. Rainwater is free. Collect it using rain barrels attached to rooftop gutters.

<u>FROM THE HUNTLEY POLICE DEPARTMENT - MAY IS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH</u>

Approximately 1 in 5 adults in the U.S. (46.6 million people) experiences mental illness in a given year but less than half get any treatment. Many police calls for service involve a mental health component. Huntley Police Department employs a full time social worker who will reach out to residents after the law enforcement interaction is complete to provide additional help and resources. We also have a number of policies and regular training on mental health, with the goal of providing the best service and meeting the

needs of the entire community while maintaining a safe and friendly village. Mental health is an incredibly important part of overall health. We are fighting the stigma and encouraging everyone to tend to their mental health needs regularly. If you or a loved one is struggling, you are not alone. There are a number of resources available. Please reach out if you are in need. Online resources include the National Alliance on Mental Illness (www.nami.org) and the National Institute of Mental Health (www.nimh.nih.gov). To get referrals to local resources, call or text 2-1-1.

To help support mental health needs in our community, we are hosting QPR Suicide Prevention Training in the Village Board Room on Wednesday, June 14 at 6:30 pm. Presented by NAMI, participants will learn to recognize the warning signs of suicide and how to apply three simple steps (question, persuade, refer) that may save a life.
