Around Town

West Main Street The McHenry County Department of Transportation will begin road resurfacing work on West Main Street in July, with an anticipated completion date of August 19. The project includes the addition of paved shoulders east of the bridge, varying from 4' to 6' in width depending on location. In addition, a left turn lane will be added for eastbound traffic turning north onto Coyne Station Road.

Mosquito Spraying The Village of Huntley's annual mosquito control program is underway, with two applications already completed. Clarke provides services that prevent mosquito breeding and suppress mosquito populations, including those that carry mosquito-borne disease. Prior to registering any product, including the Duet product used by Clarke, the EPA evaluates the product thoroughly. Duet has passed rigorous tests required by the EPA and has been approved for public health mosquito control and registered for use by the U.S. EPA in 1995. Duet is applied at extremely low dosage rates - less than an ounce per acre during the overnight hours. The spray (mist) dissipates quickly through the treatment area within 5 to 30 minutes, depending on weather conditions. Duet is applied in small droplets, which break down quickly in the environment. Since the product must hit a mosquito while it is in flight to have an effect, it is sprayed at night when mosquitoes are actively flying. You can also help fight the mosquito population by eliminating standing water on your property. Reed Road Multi-Use Bike Path Project The Village will construct a continuous multi-use path along the north side of Reed Road from the existing hot mix asphalt path at Reed Road and Vine Street to the signalized intersection of IL Route 47 and Reed Road for an approximate distance of 0.25 mile. The path segment is intended to enhance the pedestrian experience for its users and to fill a gap in the existing path network which facilitates safe access to and from schools for the surrounding neighborhoods. When completed, the project will build upon and connect to existing multi-use path networks which currently serve the Talamore residential subdivision west of Vine Street, the multi-use path network east and north of the IL Route 47 intersection with Reed Road, as well as commercial destinations. The path will also connect to the existing carriage walk pedestrian facilities along both the east and west sides of IL Route 47. Construction survey work began the week of July 20 with the staking of the path's improvements on the north side of Reed Road between Vine Street and IL Route 47. The completion date for this project is August 28.

Your Car is Hotter Than You Think

The hot days of summer are here and we all must take care of ourselves and our friends during this heat - that includes our furry friends as well. Remember that on a warm day, leaving your pet in the car while you run errands can turn dangerous in a matter of minutes. When a dog is exposed to temperatures of 105 degrees, heat stroke can set in and the dog's organs can quickly begin to fail. **When the temperature outside is 80 degrees, it takes just 20 minutes to reach over 105 degrees in the car.** On a 90 degree day, it is less than 10 minutes. People should also note that in the state of Illinois, it is a **Class A misdemeanor** to leave your pet in a life threatening situation for a prolonged period of time in extreme heat or cold conditions that results in injury to the animal. Any subsequent conviction is a Class 4 felony. If you see an animal in a car, we ask you to follow these steps:

- 1) Record information about the vehicle note the make, model, color, and license plate number
- 2) Alert management of the business they may be able to find the owner and help the animal
- 3) Call the police or animal control
- 4) Stay with the animal until help arrives

People may be inclined to take action to free the animal themselves, but be aware that **Illinois does not have a "Good Samaritan" law for pets**. There is talk in Springfield to pass legislation that allows a citizen to break a car window to rescue a hot animal and avoid criminal liability. Currently, it is best to leave this to a first responder.
