

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-2

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HURLOCK EXTENDING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARATION FOR THE TOWN OF HURLOCK FOR COVID-19

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 14-111 of the Public Safety Article of the Maryland Annotated Code and Section 404(a) of the Charter for the Town of Hurlock, Michael Henry, the Mayor of the Town of Hurlock (“Mayor Henry”), issued Executive Order 2020-1 issuing a State of Emergency Declaration for the Town of Hurlock for COVID-19 (“Emergency Declaration”) on March 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Henry issued Executive Order 2020-02 on April 8, 2020 instituting additional emergency measures; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 14-111, Mayor Henry’s Emergency Declaration may not continue or be renewed for longer than 30 days without the consent of the Council of the Town of Hurlock (the “Council”); and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020 Larry Hogan, Governor of the State of Maryland (“Governor Hogan”), announced that the State of Maryland has received a Major Disaster Declaration from the federal administration in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, it appears that Governor Hogan’s Declaration of State of Emergency and Existence of a Catastrophic Health Emergency, including any amendments, if necessary, will extend well beyond the effective 30 days of Mayor Henry’s Emergency Declaration and that Mayor Henry’s Emergency Declaration will need to be renewed beyond April 26, 2020; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor and Council desire to extend Mayor Henry’s Emergency Declaration as supplemented by Executive Order 2020-02.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HURLOCK, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION ORGANIZED IN THE STATE OF MARYLAND, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the Emergency Declaration of Mayor Henry dated March 27, 2020 as supplemented by Executive Order 2020-02 is hereby extended for an additional 30 days ending May 26, 2020 or until cancelled by order of Mayor Henry which ever is earlier.


Section 2: That the Emergency Declaration and this extension through May 26, 2020 may be further extended subject to an affirmative vote of the Council.

Section 3: This Resolution shall become effective immediately.
