ABSENTEE VOTING – VOTE AT HOME

By voting absentee, you can take the time you need to study the ballot and vote from home, and avoid appearing at your voting precinct on election day. Beginning in 2023, you may choose to be on the Absentee Application List or the Absentee Ballot List.

<p>What is it? A list for voters to receive an application for an absentee ballot for every election</p> <p>How do I receive a ballot? Return the application to the Clerk’s office to receive a ballot</p> <p>Why should I choose the Application list?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• You sometimes prefer to vote in person• You vote in November even years only• Your mailing address changes (travel, school)	<p>What is it? A list for voters to receive an absentee ballot for every election</p> <p>How do I receive a ballot? A ballot will automatically be mailed to your mailing address on file</p> <p>Why should I choose the Ballot List?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• You always vote by absentee ballot• You vote in most available elections• Your ballot will always be mailed to the same address (ballots do not forward)
