

Guide to Household Hazardous Waste Disposal

The average U.S. household can have as much as 100 pounds of hazardous waste stored throughout their house and garage. Improper disposal of these materials can contaminate drinking water, harm the environment, and create health hazards for you and your family. Simple alternatives can replace many hazardous substances. However, if you choose to use commercial products, make sure to dispose of them properly.

What Household Hazardous Waste Can I Dispose?

The Kent County Household Hazardous Waste Program accepts the following waste materials from residents:

- Oil-based paints, stains and thinner
- Pool chemicals
- Weed killers
- Insecticides & pesticides
- Cleaners
- Household batteries
- Gasoline & kerosene
- Mercury & acids
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Automobile liquids
- Solvents

Not accepted: latex paint, ammunition, fireworks, medication, needles, propane tanks, and business wastes.

Where Can I Take My Household Hazardous Waste?

To dispose of your household hazardous waste, schedule an appointment at one of the four collection centers operated by the Kent County Department of Public Works (DPW).



Where Can I Take Recyclables?

Kent County DPW also provides three drop-off stations for residential recycling of plastic bottles, paper, glass bottles, metal cans, and cardboard. Stations are located in Rockford, Grand Rapids and Kentwood. Visit www.recycleKent.org for hours, directions, and a list of accepted materials.
