RE: Urban Growth Boundary Expansion - King City 6D Urban Reserve Area


Dear Mr. Weston,

As the regional fire protection and emergency medical services provider, our District has 25 fire stations staffed by more than 400 career firefighters, a volunteer fire station, a Command and Business Operations Center, a training facility, a South Operating Center, and full-service fleet maintenance shops that serve TVF&R and many neighboring fire departments.

One of the most important assets we leave behind for the successors of this important public service is administrative stewardship over our budget, which specifically earmarks funds for capital construction projects. Thanks to the forward thinking of our Board of Directors and residents, by way of a vote in 2014, we successfully increased our local option levy from \$.25 cents for every \$1,000 / assessed to \$.45 per \$1,000 in order to meet the demands of current and future customers.

Our District is the anticipated service provider for the urban reserve area under consideration, and we look forward to working closely with city and county staff alongside our elected leaders to ensure adequate facilities are available to support the area, should it be brought in during the future Urban Growth Boundary expansion process.
