

**NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT AND
NOTICE OF INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS**

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Lincoln Park.

On or about June 11, 2021, the City of Lincoln Park will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Title 1 of the Housing & Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) as amended of the Housing and Urban/Rural Recovery Act of 1983 (PL 83-181) and the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, to undertake a project known as Streets & Utilities for the purpose of Lafayette Water Main Relocation Project, for \$1,100,000.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Lincoln Park has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file in the Office of Community Development located at 3240 Ferris, Lincoln Park MI 48146, and in various other public buildings throughout the city and may be examined or copied weekdays 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the Office of Community Development. All comments received by June 10, 2021, will be considered by the City of Lincoln Park prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Lincoln Park certifies to HUD that Thomas E. Karnes in his capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Lincoln Park to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Lincoln Park certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Lincoln Park; (b) the City of Lincoln Park has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted via email in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD CPD Detroit Field Office at CPD_COVID-19OEE-DET@hud.gov. Potential objectors should contact [HUD office] via email to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
