Letter from the Mayor


Hello Everyone,

Even in the world today one person can make a difference. A simple way is to stand up and be counted. We are in the midst of the 2020 Census. Every year Michigan receives about 29 Billion dollars in federal funding based on this information. Funding for schools, health care, police, fire and so much more. The data is also used to allot your representatives in the House of Representatives. It is critical to get this count right. The census is about ten questions and takes about ten minutes to fill out. Like everything else, it can be done on-line at 2020census.gov. You will not be questioned about citizenship status, and it is a federal crime for the census bureau to share individual census information with any person, organization or public body. This includes law enforcement. So please complete your 2020 census so Lincoln Park and Michigan can receive its full share of the resources we rely on.

We now have a new city manager, James R. Krizan. Mr. Krizan is a former Village Manager in Decatur, Michigan and most recently Assistant to the City Manager in Royal Oak. Mr. Krizan was selected from a strong field of candidates in a nationwide search through GovHR USA. We thank Mr. James Vettraino of GovHR for his assistance in the hiring process. Mr. Krizan is familiar with the City as he lives downriver. He has a Bachelor of Social Work and a Master of Public Administration from Eastern Michigan University. We look forward to what he brings to Lincoln Park.

Our search for a city manager took a little while to accomplish but it was important to get it right. We were fortunate to have an interim City Manager with the qualifications of John Zech. Mr. Zech

was the longtime City Manager of Wayne, Michigan and had assisted in Southgate and Allen Park when they needed someone on a temporary basis. We owe Mr. Zech a debt of gratitude for his hard work and dedication in our time of need.

Refund Policy:

You must apply for a refund in person at the Parks and Recreation Office (Bandshell). A \$5 Service Fee will be withheld on all patron requested refunds. No refunds will be given after the activity begins. If canceled after the session begins, a prorated amount shall be returned by check directly from City Hall in approximately 3 weeks.





DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICE

The spring and summer months are always a very busy time for the DPS. We have a variety of road projects planned, the sidewalk program will be running, crews will be out patching the roadways, street sweepers will be out, tree work will be completed along with many other tasks. The following are some guidelines that will make it easier for the DPS and City Contractors to do their job and allow us to provide the residents with better City Services.

PARKING

Please follow the No Parking times posted on the signs on each city block. The DPS tries to plan work during these times so there are less obstructions. This includes filling potholes, street sweeping, removing and/or trimming trees among other things.

TRASH, RECYCLING & YARD WASTE

The City of Lincoln Park has contracted with Green for Life (GFL) for trash pickup. Any problems with your trash or recycling cart should be directed to them by calling 888-877-4996. To report a missed pickup please call the DPS office at 313-386-9000.

Please put your trash and recycling containers on the back of the curb, NOT ON THE STREET. Receptacles need to be placed out no earlier than 6:00 p.m. the evening prior to and no later than 7:00 a.m. on your designated trash day. Containers should be at least 3 feet apart to allow the arms from the truck to grab the can to dump it. Trash cans are only to be used for household trash that contains nonhazardous material and recycling containers can only be used for recyclable materials. Relabeling your cans is prohibited and it will not be picked up. Each household is allowed one additional large item out weekly for trash. This can include items like a couch, chair, mattress, etc. If you put out an item like a refrigerator, the doors must be taken off and the freon removed.

Federal Law mandates that yard waste must be kept separate from regular trash. Yard Waste must be placed in paper yard waste bags or cans marked with a compost sticker no larger than 32 gallons and weighing no more than 50 lbs. Compost stickers are available free of charge at the DPS Building located at 500 Southfield Rd. or at City Hall located at 1355 Southfield Road. Concrete and fill dirt cannot be mixed in or disposed of with yard waste. Items like tree branches should be bundled with twine no more than 3 feet in length.

TREES

Trees located in the easement area of the property (between the sidewalk and the street) are the responsibility of the City of Lincoln Park and may not be cut down or trimmed without the permission of the Department of Public Services. If you have a tree in the easement that you believe is dead or diseased, please contact the DPS to have it evaluated. An employee of the DPS will inspect the tree and determine the best course of action. Trees that are deemed healthy will not be removed, even if it is damaging the sidewalk. The City does have a cost sharing program with homeowners if the sidewalk is damaged or lifted from an easement tree. Please call the DPS at 313-386-9000 to inquire about this program.

POTHOLES

There are two ways to report a pothole that is located on a roadway maintained by the City. There is a tab on the City Website, **www.citylp.com** labeled "report a pothole". Please fill in as much information as possible and submit the concern. You may also call the DPS at 313-386-9000 to report your concern. The roadways of Fort Street, Southfield, Dix and Outer Drive are not maintained by the City. To report a pothole on those roadways please call Wayne County Roads Division at 1-888-762-3273.

CATCH BASINS

Catch Basins take rainwater and snow melt off away from the streets through the storm water system. This is a separate system from the Sanitary Sewer System. It is important that Catch Basins remain clean and free of debris. Residents that have a catch basin in front of their home are asked to periodically check it and sweep or clean it off when necessary. It is also against City Ordinance to blow leaves or grass clippings in the street. They can block the catch basins and stop the water from flowing into the system thus causing flooding in the roadway.

WATER MAIN BREAK

If you see water bubbling out of the ground, it may indicate a water main break. To report a water main break Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. please call the DPS at 313-386-9000. If it occurs after these hours, reports can be made by calling the non-emergency police phone number at 313-381-1800.

Dog Licenses: Great news for dog owners! Beginning May 1st, you can purchase a multi-year license for your dog. All dogs 6 months and older must be licensed. Licenses for 2020 will be available for sale in the month of May and are due by June 1. A dog license can be purchased in the City Clerk's Office M-F from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. You must present a current rabies certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian.

*Senior rate is available to owners who are age 62 by June 1st of the current year. A \$6 late fee will be imposed if not purchased by the due date of June 1st.

Birth & Death Certificates: Lincoln Park Birth and Death Certificates are available M-F from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. with proper identification. Forms are available on the City's official website at www.citylp.com. Due to privacy laws, these certificates are only available by mail or in person.

Garage/Yard Sale: A permit is required to have a Garage/ Yard/Estate Sale. Each residence is allowed to purchase two permits/year. Duration of each permit shall not exceed three (3) consecutive days. The fee for a permit is \$10 and must be obtained prior to commencing the sale.

Specialty Permits: All Door to Door Sales, Ice cream Peddlers, Junk Dealers and many other specialty Licenses are required and are available from the City Clerk's Office, all must be secured prior to commencing operation in our city.

NOTICE: Registration and picture ID issued by the City Clerk's Office is required for any individuals peddling merchandise or soliciting door-to-door in the residential areas. Please be advised that anyone coming to your door without proper picture identification should be reported immediately to the Police Department at (313) 381-1800.

Block Parties: Block party Petitions must be submitted to the City Clerk's office no less than 3 weeks prior to the event. Forms & regulations are available on the City's official website at **www.citylp.com**.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone to follow the guidelines that have been put in place by the State of Michigan Department of Health & Human Service and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus.

Symptoms of COVID-19 are difficulty breathing, shortness of breath, cough and fever.

If you have questions about the COVID-19 regarding where to get tested or think you may have been exposed but don't have life threatening symptoms, please call your primary physician, Wayne County Health Department at 211 or 734-287-7870, www.waynecounty.com or the State of Michigan Dept of Health & Human Services by visiting www.Michigan.gov/coronavirus.

What to expect when you call 911:

If you need emergency service, please do not hesitate to call 9-1-1. We are responding to all emergency calls. Our dispatchers will ask questions to determine if you have been exposed to the Coronavirus or are experiencing symptoms of the virus. You may only see one EMS responder at first, with the rest of the response team waiting outside and they may ask questions from a distance before making physical contact. EMS responders may be wearing protective equipment such as masks, gowns and eye protection. Do not be alarmed - this is to protect both the patients and EMS personnel to reduce the possibility of spreading the virus.

Remember the best way to protect yourself and family is to practice social distancing, which means avoiding close contact with people and staying at least 6 feet away. Wash your hands OFTEN for at least 20 seconds, avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth, cover your cough or sneeze with tissue or cough into your elbow, and clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a disinfectant.

Lastly, please look out for any of your neighbors that may need assistance, or those who are most susceptible to the virus.

MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

Now that our clocks have been moved forward for Daylight Savings, the batteries in our smoke detectors need to be changed on Easter. It's also time to start thinking about some warmer weather safety tips. As we see the days beginning to get longer, we all tend to spend more time outside in the fresh air. Please keep these safety tips in mind:

Outside and Around the Yard

- Make sure your address numbers are up and visible from the street
- Use eye and ear protection while operating machinery.
- Keep children and pets at a safe distance while operating outdoor equipment.
- Add fuel before starting gas powered engines, not when they are running or hot.
- Fuel should be stored in approved containers, away from ignition source. An outdoor shed is the ideal location for fuel storage.

Outdoor Cooking

- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Never leave your grill unattended.

Inside the Home

- Check your fire extinguishers
- · Check for overloaded or damaged extension cords
- Replace or clean your furnace filter. A dirty filter can lower the efficiency of the heating/cooling system, increase heating costs and cause fires.
- Clean the clothes dryer exhaust duct, damper and space under the dryer. Poor maintenance allows lint to build up in the exhaust duct and cause fire

We would also like to remind the residents about the importance of safety while using a fire-pit: Outdoor fire-pits must be used in accordance with the manufacturer recommendations. Only approved containers will be permitted, and dry, seasoned firewood must be used. Always make sure fire is attended by an adult with a UL rated fire extinguisher or garden hose nearby. Please look for our Public Service Announcement YouTube video which deals specifically with recreational fires.

Reminder:

There is NO leaf or debris burning allowed in Lincoln Park.

Your Lincoln Park Fire Department will be on-duty 24/7 to handle your emergencies. We hope you have a safe Spring/Summer!

Happy Spring! Remember those property assessment statements you received in March? Hold on to those for filing your 2020 income taxes next year. This gives you your property information for your State return.

2020 Property Tax Bill Update

The 2020 Summer Tax Bills will be mailed in July and are due August 20, 2020. It is very important to remember that in order to use the three-payment installment plan, the first payment for the 2020 Summer taxes must be made by August 20th. If not, then the entire amount of the Summer taxes are due with a 1% penalty added for each month. Per our City Charter, there are no exceptions to this requirement.

Tax bills are mailed to the owners of the property at the mailing addresses provided and to mortgage companies. If you are not the owner of the property described on the tax bill you receive, please forward it to the owner or return it to the Treasurer's Office. If you no longer maintain an escrow account with a mortgage company and do not receive a tax bill, please contact the Treasurer's Office.

Persons who qualify for a tax deferment may do so up to September 15th. You may obtain the forms from the Treasurer's Office or our website at **www.citylp.com**, under the Treasurer's Department.

Credit Card Reminder

The Treasurer's Office accepts Visa, Master Card, Discover, American Express and Debit cards with the Visa or Master Card logo, for a 3% fee. Picture identification and credit card are required. We also accept credit card payment for taxes and water bills on the website at www.citylp.com.

When paying taxes online, the payment must be for the exact amount. No partial payments or rounding up will be accepted. You may now pay your taxes and water bills at the Lincoln Park Community Credit Union located at 1400 Emmons, Lincoln Park. You do not need to be a member to utilize this service. They only accept cash or check, and you must have your bill present.
