Letter from the Mayor

Hello Everyone, Happy Winter!

MARIJUANA: The ballot proposal was approved on November 5 to allow marijuana facilities to operate in the city. Your Council is now engaged in preparing the ordinances necessary for the businesses to start. Look to our website, **www.citylp.com**, to remain current on updates.

CITIZEN ACADEMY: I send my congratulations to the 8 people who graduated from the 2nd annual Police Citizen Academy. This nine-week program was started by Chief Raymond Watters last year. It gives attendees an overview of police work and an opportunity for hands-on training. The Chief will be accepting applications for the 3rd annual Citizen Academy in August of 2020. The spots are limited so mark a "to do" reminder in your phone to apply in August.

CITY MANAGEMENT: We said good bye to our City Manager, Matt Coppler, who accepted employment with the city of St. Clair Shores. Mr. Coppler did an excellent job for us and we thank him for his service. We are fortunate to have John Zech as an Interim City manager as we search for our next city manager. Mr. Zech has a wealth of experience from his decades of service with the cities of Wayne, Southgate, and Allen Park. He also served on the RTAB that oversaw Lincoln Park coming out of receivership. To assist Mr. Zech, who is working limited hours, Lisa Griggs is assisting with city management duties. Ms. Griggs is the city's finance director. The firm Govhr has been retained and is in the process of finding another city manager. It is anticipated that we will have a new person in place early in the new year.

RECYCLING: All of you should have received your blue recycling bins. I encourage you to make a serious effort. Every item that is

recycled is one that is not going to the landfill. I can say from personal experience that my family's volume of trash has gone down significantly in the past few weeks. Remember that collections are the same day as your trash collection, and you can put it out each week even if it is not full. Please check our website for the items that are okay to recycle. Our goal is to reduce the amount of trash going to the landfill, thereby reducing our and your cost. Thank you all for your efforts.

Refund Policy:

You must apply for a refund in person at the Parks and Recreation Office (Bandshell). A \$5 Service Fee will be withheld on all patron requested refunds. No refunds will be given after the activity begins. If canceled after the session begins, a prorated amount shall be returned by check directly from City Hall in approximately 3 weeks.

Taxi and Van Service: The City of LP Parks and Recreation/ Senior Department has a service agreement with Downriver Cab for taxi service with subsidized rates. Residents (60 years & up) and disabled individuals who meet eligibility requirements and produce a valid State ID or Driver's License, may purchase a maximum of 40 (\$2.50) tokens a month for \$1.50 each with the city paying the additional \$1. Tokens can be used anywhere taxi service is available. Eligible residents will be charged the normal taximeter rate payable with city tokens. Call (313) 386-1817.



DOG LICENSES:

2019 licenses expire on June 1st – renewal licenses are available May 1st. All dogs 6 months and older must be licensed. A dog license can be purchased in the City Clerk's Office M-F, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. You must present a current rabies certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian. A Senior rate is available to owners who are age 62 by June 1 of the current year. A \$6.00 late fee will be imposed on renewals if not purchased by the due date of June 1st.

YARD/GARAGE SALES: Prior to any sale, A CITY PERMIT IS REQUIRED. Sales are limited to 2 per year. The permit is issued for up to 3 consecutive days at a cost of \$10.00

Special Event Permits, Peddler & Hawkers, Solicitors, Used Auto Dealers, Junk Dealers, All Door to Door Sales and many other specialty licenses are required and are available from the City Clerk's Office. All must be secured prior to commencing operation in our city.

NOTICE:

Registration and picture ID issued by the City Clerk's Office is required for individuals peddling merchandise or soliciting doorto-door in the residential areas. Be advised that anyone coming to your door without proper picture identification should be reported immediately to the Police Department at (313) 381-1800.

TRASH

The City of Lincoln Park has contracted with GFL Environmental, Inc. (Greener for Life) for Trash pickup. Trash must be placed on your curb no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before and no later than 7 a.m. on your scheduled trash day. Trash put out after 7 a.m. may not be picked up. Trash bins must be placed on the curb, not in the roadway. If you have any issues regarding your trash pickup or your trash was missed, please contact GFL Environmental. Inc. directly at 844-464-3587, or the Department of Public Services at 313-386-9000. Any other questions regarding items that are permissible to be picked up may be asked by calling either of these numbers. The City of Lincoln Park no longer provides for special pickups. Every residence is permitted one bulk item per week out with your regular trash. If a residence has more than the allotted amount of bulk trash, these items may be taken to the Department of Public Services for a fee. Please contact The Department of Public Services for any dumping questions.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

What do you do with your Christmas Tree when Christmas is over? Well the City, with GFL Environmental, Inc., provides a means for residents to safely dispose of your Christmas Tree. If your tree is 6 feet or less in height, you may place it at the curbside on your designated trash day and GFL Environmental, Inc. will pick it up. Trees that are over 6 feet will need to be cut in half before putting it to the curbside. This is a service the City provides to make your holidays easier.

SNOW

As the snow begins to fall, it is vital that the Department of Public Service be able to remove it from the streets so as to provide you with safe access. If a snow emergency is declared, all vehicles must be moved off the City streets until the emergency expires. Vehicles left on the streets may be ticketed and/or towed. Snow Emergencies will be posted on the City website, City marquee, City cable channel and the local news channels. In the event of a snow fall where there is no snow emergency declared, it is extremely helpful to the DPS for cars to be off the road so we may plow and salt in a faster more efficient manner. It is imperative that trash bins be placed on the curb not in the roadway in order for Plow Trucks to have full access to the road. The DPS will work as quickly as possible to remove snow from the roadway. Cooperation from residents is vital to this operation. During the course of snow removal, snow will be pushed into driveway

approaches. Unfortunately there is nothing that can be done to prevent this from occurring. Please do not shovel or push this snow back into the roadway.

WATERMAIN BREAKS

If you witness water bubbling out of the ground, it may be an indication of a watermain break. To report a watermain break during normal operating hours (Monday - Friday 7:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.), please call 313-386-9000, or stop in at the Department of Public Services at 500 Southfield Road. After hours, weekends and/or holidays, please call the Police Department at 313-381-1800 and they will contact the Water Department personnel on call. The sooner the main break is discovered and repaired, the less inconvenience and water loss there will be.

HOME PLUMBING

Please remember while preparing your home for another Michigan winter, take the time to inspect your plumbing and take the necessary measures to prevent it from freezing. If you have a crawlspace, make sure all exposed pipes and meters are protected from cold air. Whenever possible, all pipes should be in a heated area or wrapped with pipe insulation. If your meter and/ or pipes are located inside of a cabinet, it is best to leave the door open to expose them to warmer air. If you are going away for an extended period of time this winter, your home should remain heated at 40 degrees Fahrenheit, or have your water shut off and the water system drained to eliminate the possibility of frozen/broken pipes. If your pipes break or your meter freezes, you as the homeowner are responsible for any water loss, meter replacement costs, and any other damages caused by the break.

CROSS CONNECTION CONTROL PROGRAM

The City of Lincoln Park is required under Public Act 399, Part 14, to maintain a cross connection control program to identify and eliminate any possible connections that could contaminate the public water system. The City has implemented a program for its commercial and industrial customers for a number of years; however, in order to fully comply with this State mandate, we must include residential customers as part of this program. The City has contracted with HydroCorp of Troy, MI to assist with facilitating this program. The residential program consists of both inspections of the exterior of homes and periodic testing of backflow prevention assemblies, which are typically found on lawn irrigation systems. These backflow preventers are installed on plumbing systems to ensure contaminated water or other substances cannot be introduced to the home or the public water supply.

Property Taxes

The 2019 County Tax Bills are being mailed in December. If you do not receive your county tax bill and no longer have an escrow account with a mortgage company, please contact our office.

County taxes are due February 18, 2020. After that date, there will be a 1% penalty until the end of February. After February 28, please contact Wayne County Treasurer's Office at 313-224-5990 for information on delinguent taxes.

Reminder: If you are making installments on the 2019 summer taxes, your third installment is due February 28. If you have deferred your summer tax payment, the due date is February 15.

To view your tax and assessing information, please visit www.citylp.com and click on the Tax and Assessing link.

You may now pay your taxes and water bills at the Lincoln Park Community Credit Union located at 1400 Emmons, Lincoln Park. You do not need to be a member to utilize this service. They only accept cash or check, and you must have your bill present.

Avoid the long lines and pay your taxes and water bills online at www.citylp.com and click on the Pay Now button. There is a nominal fee for this service. When paying your taxes on line, the payment must be for the exact amount. Partial payments will not be accepted and will be rejected.

The Treasurer's Office accepts Visa, Master Card, Discover, and American Express cards. There is a 3% fee for all credit/debit card transactions made in person at City Hall. Picture identification and possession of credit card are required.

Checks are accepted only as conditional payment. If the check is denied upon presentation to the bank, the tax will be restored as unpaid to the tax roll without further notice and will be subject to all applicable interest and penalty charges.

MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

As winter settles in, I'd like to take an opportunity to suggest some cold weather and fire safety tips to make your home safer:

Smoke Alarms

Have a working smoke alarm on every level of your home. If you haven't checked your batteries recently, check them now.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Have a CO alarm within 15 feet of each sleeping area of your home. Test batteries today. Symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning include sleepiness, headaches and dizziness. If you suspect carbon monoxide poisoning, ventilate the area and call 911.

· Use of Heaters

Keep combustible materials such as newspapers, furniture or clothes at least 3 feet (36 inches) away from portable heaters. Never place portable heaters at the bottom of the stairway this will block the escape route in the event of a fire. For electric heaters, check cords for cracks or breaks.

- Make sure that outlets are designed to handle the load. Be safe. Do not plug anything else into the socket with the heater.
- Never run generators indoors.
- · Never use an oven to heat your home.

With the cold weather already upon us, we would also like to remind the residents about the importance of safety while using a fireplace:

- Before starting a fire in the fireplace, remove all decorations (including stockings hung by the fireplace) and be sure the flue is open.
- · Have fireplace flues checked/cleaned.
- · Always use a screen in front of the fireplace. Also, consider using a fire-resistant carpet or mat (made for fireplaces) on the floor in front of the fireplace.
- · Keep children & pets at a safe distance.

Lastly, I'd like to take a moment and ask that you look after your elderly relatives and neighbors this winter. Help them to check their smoke and

carbon monoxide detectors and replace the batteries. Ensure that they are warm but follow the safety tips listed above. It is also important that we help them with snow removal so that they can attend doctor appointments or so that EMS personnel can enter the home quickly when help is needed. Have a great winter season and STAY SAFE!

Your Lincoln Park Fire Department will be on-duty 24/7 to handle your emergencies. We hope you have a safe winter season!
