Last November, the voters approved the ballot proposal in favor of recreational use of marijuana. The cities were given the choice to decide to opt in and allow the businesses in town or to opt out and forbid it. Initially, we voted to opt out, but I reconsidered my vote and the decision was delayed until October. The reasons for the change in vote was to see what the regulations put in by the state would be and to gather public input on the businesses. A survey was put out and a committee was formed to analyze that data. The committee was also charged with researching if it is in Lincoln Park's financial best interest to allow a limited number of the businesses.

### LINCOLN PARK/ MELVINDALE PARTNERSHIP

City of Lincoln Park has entered into a partnership with the City of Melvindale that allows residents from each community to utilize recreational facilities and programming at the resident rate of each city. This partnership will increase the recreational opportunities to both communities' residents without increasing the cost of providing these valuable services. "Lincoln Park's recreation partnership with Melvindale enhances the quality of life for residents of both communities by providing increased recreational opportunities without increasing the tax burden already placed upon them," declared Lincoln Park Mayor Thomas E. Karnes.

The pool is typically open between June and September with seasonal and daily passes available, The Kessey Field House has two indoor soccer fields and is attached to their Community Event Center that can accommodate up to 180 guest for banquets or meetings.

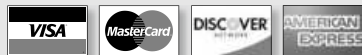
### The following is required to register for rec programs:

- A parent is needed to register children under 18.
- The rates listed are the Early Bird Rates.  
To get these rates, register before first day of class.
- Up-to-date Driver's License or State ID required for residents.
- Up-to-date Driver's License required for credit cards / personal checks.

If circumstance allows, individuals may be able to register after the program deadline date. A late fee of \$5 will be assessed. Unless otherwise noted, the program deadline date shall be the day before the class begins.

### Refund Policy:

You must apply for a refund in person at the Parks and Recreation Office (Bandshell). A \$5 Service Fee will be withheld on all patron requested refunds. No refunds will be given after the activity begins. If canceled after the session begins, a prorated amount shall be returned by check directly from City Hall in approximately 3 weeks.

LP residents (60 years & up) and disabled individuals who meet eligibility requirements and produce a valid State ID or Driver's License, may purchase a maximum of 40 (\$2.50) tokens a month for \$1.50 each with the city paying the additional \$1. These tokens can be used anywhere taxi service is available. Eligible residents will be charged the normal taximeter rate payable with city tokens. Call (313) 386-1817. 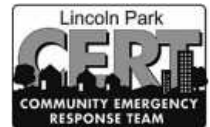
### Lincoln Park Citizen's Patrol Watch

## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICE

### TRASH

The City of Lincoln Park has contracted with GFL Environmental, Inc. (Greener for Life) for Trash pickup. Trash must be placed on your curb no earlier than 6pm the night before and no later than 7am on your scheduled trash day. Trash put out after 7am may not be picked up. Trash bins must be placed on the curb, not in the roadway. If you have any issues regarding your trash pickup or your trash was missed, please contact GFL Environmental, Inc. directly at (844) 464-3587, or the Department of Public Services at (313) 386-9000. The City of Lincoln Park no longer provides for special pickups. Every residence is permitted one bulk item per week out with your regular trash. If a residence has more than the allotted amount of bulk trash, these items may be taken to the Department of Public Services for a fee. Please contact The Department of Public Services for any dumping questions.

### CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

What do you do with your Christmas Tree when Christmas is over? Well the City, with GFL Environmental, Inc., provides a means for residents to safely dispose of your Christmas Tree. If your tree is 6 feet or less in height, you may place it at the curbside on your designated trash day and GFL Environmental, Inc. will pick it up. Trees that are over 6 feet will need to be cut in half before putting it to the curbside. This is a service the City provides to make your holidays easier.

**SNOW:** As the snow begins to fall, it is vital that the Department of Public Service be able to remove it from the streets so as to provide you with safe access. If a snow emergency is declared, all vehicles must be moved off of the City streets. Vehicles left on the streets may be ticketed and/or towed. Snow Emergencies will be posted on the City website, City marquee, City cable channel and the local news channels. In the event of a snow

fall where there is a snow emergency declared, it is extremely helpful to the DPS for cars to be off the road so we may plow and salt in a faster more efficient manner. The DPS will work as quickly as possible to remove snow from the roadway. Cooperation from residents is vital to this operation. During the course of snow removal, snow will be pushed into driveway approaches. Unfortunately there is nothing that can be done to prevent this from occurring. Please do not shovel or push this snow back into the roadway,

### WATERMAIN BREAKS

If you witness water bubbling out of the ground, it may be an indication of a watermain break. To report a watermain break during normal operating hours (Monday-Friday 7:30am-3pm), please call (313) 386-9000, or stop in at the Department of Public Services at 500 Southfield Road. After hours, weekends and/or holidays, please call the Police Department at (313) 381-1800 and they will contact the Water Department personnel on call. The sooner the main break is discovered and repaired, the less inconvenience and water loss there will be.

### HOME PLUMBING

Please remember while preparing your home for another Michigan winter, take the time to inspect your plumbing and take the necessary measures to prevent it from freezing. If you have a crawlspace, make sure all exposed pipes and meters are protected from cold air. Whenever possible, all pipes should be in a heated area or wrapped with pipe insulation. If your meter and/or pipes are located inside of a cabinet, it is best to leave the door open to expose them to warmer air. If you are going away for an extended period of time this winter, your home should remain heated at 40 degrees Fahrenheit, or your water shut off and the water system drained to eliminate the possibility of frozen/broken pipe. If your pipes break or your meter freezes, you as the homeowner are responsible for any water loss, meter replacement costs, and any other damages caused by the break.

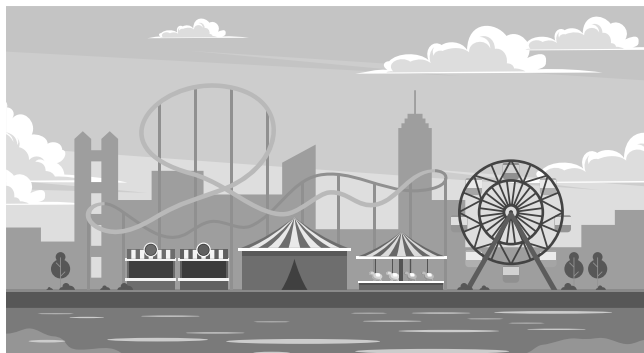

## MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

With summer activities in full swing, we start thinking about the kids returning to school and raking the fall leaves. This is also a good time to replace the batteries in your smoke detectors and practice some safety tips:

### Outside and Around the Yard

- Make sure your address numbers are up and visible from the street
- Use eye and ear protection while operating machinery.
- Keep children and pets at a safe distance while operating outdoor equipment.
- Add fuel before starting gas powered engines, not when they are running or hot.
- Fuel should be stored in approved containers, away from ignition source. An outdoor shed is the ideal location for fuel storage.

### Outdoor Cooking

- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Never leave your grill unattended.

### Inside the Home

- Check your fire extinguishers
- Check for overloaded or damaged extension cords
- Replace or clean your furnace filter. A dirty filter can lower the efficiency of the heating/cooling system, increase heating costs and cause fires.
- Clean the clothes dryer exhaust duct, damper, and space under the dryer. Poor maintenance allows lint to build up in the exhaust duct and cause fire

The Lincoln Park Fire Department is pleased to announce we will be visiting all Elementary Schools in the city again this year to give a fire safety talk to all Kindergarten through 3rd Graders.

Your Lincoln Park Fire Department will be on-duty 24/7 to handle your emergencies. We hope you have a safe fall season!

**Reminder:** There is NO leaf or debris burning allowed in Lincoln Park. Outdoor fire-pits must be used in accordance with the manufacturer recommendations. Only approved containers will be permitted, and dry, seasoned firewood must be used. Always make sure fire is attended by an adult with a UL rated fire extinguisher or garden hose nearby. Please look for our Public Service Announcement YouTube video which deals specifically with recreational fires.

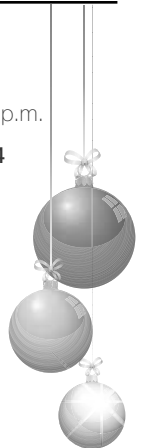
