Stay up to date on the I-75 Rouge River Bridge Project




meeting to provide an update on the I-75 Rouge River Detroit Downriver Connection project will occur from 5:30pm to 7:30pm.



GFL Trash Cart Placement Guidelines

Wondering why your trash may have been missed in the past? It could be because the automated trash collection vehicles used by GFL was unable to safely reach your trash cart.

Wondering where to place your trash cart to ensure it's picked up?

Please place trash carts off the pavement and near the edge of your lawn (between the curb and your sidewalk). The automated truck's robotic arm must be able to reach out to the canister and not touch any obstacles

Changes to The Building Fee Schedule Take Effect November 1st, 2017

Starting November 1st:

- The Rental Registration Fee of \$300 will be doubled to \$600 when a property is found by the City to be a rental property and the owner has not registered the property.
- The Vacant Property Registration fee of \$150 will be doubled to \$300 when a property is found by the City to be a vacant property and the owner has not registered the property.
- The building permit fee <u>will be doubled</u> when work is started before the issuance of necessary permit.

The City is offering a grace period to have rental and vacant properties registered properly before the deadline date.



NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

Riverbank Avenue Reconstruction and Water Main Replacement (Ferris Avenue to Wilson Avenue) Pavement Removals

Through a selective bidding process, the City of Lincoln Park has awarded Hard Rock Concrete of Westland, Michigan a contract to complete the water main replacement and road reconstruction of Riverbank Avenue from Ferris Avenue to Wilson Avenue. On Monday, September 25, 2017, Hard Rock Concrete anticipates starting the removal of pavement on the south half of the street including all driveway approaches on the south half of the street. Therefore, residents on the south side of the street will not have access to their driveways for approximately 2-3 weeks while the Contractor removes, preps and places the new concrete pavement for the south half of the street. Once concrete pavement is placed, 5-7 days is required to allow the concrete to cure prior to opening to traffic. Once opened to traffic, temporary maintenance aggregate will be placed in your driveway approach to allow access until the driveway approaches are poured back.
