



NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

Lafayette Avenue Intersection Improvements

Paris Avenue, College Avenue, Morris Avenue, Reo Avenue

April 25, 2019

Through a selective bidding process, the City of Lincoln Park has awarded JB Contractors of Detroit, Michigan a contract to complete the full reconstruction of the intersections along Lafayette Avenue at Paris Avenue, College Avenue, Morris Avenue and Reo Avenue including replacement of sidewalk ramps to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance. Work is anticipated to start on Wednesday, May 1, 2019.

The following provides answers to common questions during road reconstruction projects.

When will the Contractor be working?

Allowable working hours within the City of Lincoln Park are from 7:00am to 9:00pm Monday through Friday, with occasional work taking place on Saturdays. The Contractor expects on most days to work from 7:00am to 5:00pm; however, following the placement of concrete, it is possible sawcutting of joints may take place after 5:00pm.

Will there be any street closures?

This project will be constructed in two (2) phases. Phase 1 will remove and replace the westerly half of all intersections. Therefore, all side streets to the west of Lafayette Avenue will be closed to through traffic and will have to access their street from Howard Avenue. Once new concrete has been placed and has cured, the easterly half of all intersections will be removed and replaced; therefore, during this phase all side streets to the east of Lafayette Avenue will be closed to through traffic and will have to access their street from Fort Park Boulevard.

Will access to driveways be maintained during construction?

No driveway approaches are within the construction limits for this project; therefore, all residents will continue to have access to their driveways.

Will there be disruptions to mail service or garbage pick-up?

No. Mail will continue to be delivered as normal. Garbage will also continue to be picked up during construction. You can continue to place your garbage at the curb and will be picked up. I

Will my irrigation system be disrupted during construction?

If you have an irrigation system, your irrigation system can remain operable during construction. If you have a sprinkler system and reside on a corner lot along Lafayette Avenue where work will take place, to prevent any damage during construction, we ask that you mark or flag where sprinkler systems may be located within the right-of-way (between the road and sidewalk). If sprinkler systems are accidentally damaged, the Contractor will be required to replace as a part of this project.

Are trees being removed as a part of the project?

No trees are scheduled to be removed as part of this project.

What is being done to restore the site following construction?

Upon completion of the project, all disturbed areas within the greenbelt will be replaced with topsoil, seed and mulch.

Will dust be a nuisance during construction?

The Contractor, on a regular basis, will be required to sweep the travel lanes during construction and all adjacent side streets to control dust as much as possible; however, this will be an active construction zone, and dust will exist and should be expected.

We apologize for any inconvenience that this work is causing, but trust that you will understand the benefit of this project once it is completed.
