




 - Amygdala
- Dopamine, Oxytocin and Endorphins

Annual report story

- Protagonist: Lisa, Public Health Nurse
- Passion: Loves working with older adults; ensuring their homes are safe.
- Challenge: Client who was overwhelmed by her home.
- Transformation: Focused on a small area of home.
- Pivot to larger issues: By taking small steps, we can do anything.
- Happy Ending: Increase in client's confidence, safe home.

- Comment box in clinic or customer surveys




When you don't have access to paid leave, you are more likely to come to work or send your children to school while sick. This can worsen or prolong illnesses and increase infection rates.
