Mayor Blankenship called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. On roll call the following Aldermen were present: Joanne Lawrence, Murlin Bettinger, Doris Rapp, Donna White, Gina Herndon and Melissa Freeman

Following roll call, Mayor Blankenship led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and Doris Rapp opened the meeting with prayer.

Approve Order of Agenda: Alderman Lawrence made the motion to approve the order of the agenda as presented. Alderman Rapp seconded. Motion passed on roll call vote as follows:

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Accept the resignations of Patricia Lane and Amber Eggimann: Alderman White made the motion to accept employment resignations from Patricia Lane and Amber Eggimann. Alderman Bettinger seconded. Motion passed on roll call vote as follows:

Marionville Fire and Aurora Rural Fire District: Resolution 02-2022R "A RESOLUTION TO PETITION THE AURORA RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT TO ANNEX THE CITY OF MARIONVILLE INTO ITS BOUNDARIES": Mayor Blankenship read Resolution 02-2022R in its entirety. This resolution is to seek signatures to petition to be annexed into the Aurora Rural Fire Protection District. Alderman Freeman made the motion to approve Resolution 02-2022R "A RESOLUTION TO PETITION THE AURORA RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT TO ANNEX THE CITY OF MARIONVILLE INTO ITS BOUNDARIES" as presented and Alderman Herndon seconded. Motion passed on roll call vote as follows:

NEW BUSINESS

P & Z Recommendation on dividing Parcel (117035003027003000) NW corner of Euclid and South: The Planning and Zoning Commission made the recommendation to approve the request to divide this parcel into two (2) lots. Alderman Rapp made the motion to accept Planning and Zoning's recommendation approving dividing parcel 117035003027003000. Alderman Lawrence seconded. Motion passed on roll call vote as follows:

- 4) Sutherlands---2022 Fastrak FT730 60", eight thousand ninety-nine dollars (\$8099.00)

It was noted as far as maintenance on the mower, Marionville Powersports would be closer. Alderman Freeman made the motion to accept the quote from Marionville Powersports for the 60" Bad Boy mower. Seconded by Alderman Rapp. Motion passed on roll call vote as follows:

Re-appoint Carol Cook to the Marionville Housing Authority Board: Mayor Blankenship re-appointed Carol Cook to the Marionville Housing Authority Board for a three (3) year term. Board Of Adjustment appointments: Mayor Blankenship appointed Crystal Snider for a five (5) year term to the Board of Adjustment and Joey Holder to be an alternate. 


ADJOURNMENT
