



2023 Street Rehabilitation Project

Construction Update

September 1, 2023

Stinson Boulevard/Pleasant View Drive:

This week, the Contractor installed the north concrete pedestrian ramp at the intersection of Stinson Boulevard/Pleasant View Drive and Osborne Road.

Next week, the Contractor is anticipated to reinstall mailboxes along the project area and resume restoration of the boulevard behind the new trail.

Cheri Lane/Fillmore Street:

This week, the Contractor completed installation of new concrete curb & gutter at previously removed locations along 53rd Avenue, Cheri Lane and Fillmore Street.

Next week, the Contractor is anticipated to install pavement patches in front of the new curb and begin backfilling behind the new curb.

South Industrial Center:

This week, the Contractor completed installation of new concrete curb & gutter at previously removed locations along 51st Way and the East River Road East Service Drive.

Next week, the Contractor is anticipated to install pavement patches in front of the new curb and begin backfilling behind the new curb.

East River Road West Service Drive (Georgetown):

This week, the Contractor installed cured-in-place-pipe (CIPP) liner to the existing water main along East River Road from the west service drive to Island Park Drive.

Next week, the Contractor will reinstate the lined segment of water main and complete pavement restoration along East River Road and Island Park Drive. Following pavement restoration, the road closure at Island Park Drive and lane closure along southbound East River Road will be lifted.

Please note that all construction scheduling is tentative, weather-dependent, and subject to change.

Construction

The Contractor's hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday-Friday. There is potential for occasional work outside of these hours upon City approval.

Please keep in mind that this type of construction may generate noise, dust, mud, and be disruptive to the area. Please be patient with the Contractor and contact us if you have any concerns we can help with.

Resident Access

The City and Contractor will work to minimize inconvenience to residents during construction. Residents can expect to have driveway access during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street. We ask that residents, including children, remain outside the immediate work zone and exercise caution navigating the project area wherever you see workers, equipment, or warning signs.
