### WATER EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, by declaration date, June 2, 1992, Richard T. Roth, Mayor of the Village/Town of Mount Kisco did declare a water emergency pursuant to Section 105-3 of the Code of the Village/Town of Mount Kisco,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, John T. Pierpont, Village Manager of the Village/Town of Mount Kisco, acting pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 105-4(A) of the Code of the Village/Town of Mount Kisco, do hereby impose water use restrictions for the duration of the water emergency in accordance with the following regulations.

A. The water restrictions to be imposed shall be determined by comparing the level of Byram Lake at 9:00 am on Monday of each week to the average level of Byram Lake on the most nearly comparable date for the preceding ten years, as follows:

- (1) If the level of Byram Lake is above the ten-year average, Level I water use restrictions shall be in effect.
- (2) If the level of Byram Lake is not more than the ten-year average, but not less than ninety-five percent (95%) of such average, Level II water use restrictions shall be in effect.
- (3) If the level of Byram Lake is less than ninety-five percent (95%) of the tenyear average, but not less than ninety percent (90%) of such average Level III water use restrictions shall be in effect.
- (4) If the level of Byram Lake is less than ninety percent (90%) of the ten-year average, Level IV water use restrictions shall be in effect.
- B. The water use restrictions imposed shall be as follows:

# (1) Level I water use restrictions shall be as follows:

- (a) No person shall serve water to a customer in a restaurant except on the specific request of such customer. It shall be the responsibility of the owner of the restaurant to ensure compliance with this restriction.
- (b) No person shall use water to clean a driveway or sidewalk.
- (c) No person shall use water at the exterior of an odd-numbered property on an even-numbered day. No person shall use water at the exterior of an even-numbered property on an odd-numbered day. For purposes of this provision, a property having no number will be considered to be an odd-numbered property.
- (d) No person shall water a lawn or garden except between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 am and between the hours of 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm on the permitted day pursuant to paragraph (c) above.

## (2) Level II water use restrictions shall be as follows:

- (a) No person shall serve water to a customer in a restaurant except on the specific request of such customer. It shall be the responsibility of the owner of the restaurant to ensure compliance with this restriction.
- (b) No person shall use water to clean a driveway or sidewalk.
- (c) No person shall use water at the exterior of an odd-numbered property on an even-numbered day. No person shall use water at the exterior of an even-numbered property on an odd-numbered day. For purposes of this provision, a property having no number will be considered to be an odd-numbered property.
- (d) No person shall water a lawn or garden except between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 am and between the hours of 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm on the permitted day pursuant to paragraph (c) above.
- (e) No running water may be used to wash a car or other vehicle. Cars and other vehicles may be washed only using water from a bucket or other container.

### (3) Level III water use restrictions shall be as follows:

- (a) No person shall serve water to a customer in a restaurant except on the specific request of such customer. It shall be the responsibility of the owner of the restaurant to ensure compliance with this restriction.
- (b) No person shall use water at the exterior of a premises, except that:
  - (1) The lawn or garden of an odd-numbered property, or a property having no number, may be watered on odd-numbered days between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 am and 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm; and,
  - (2) The lawn or garden of an even-numbered property may be watered on even-numbered days between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 am and 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm; and
  - (3) Cars and other vehicles may be washing using water from a bucket or other container.

### (4) Level IV water use restrictions shall be as follows:

- (a) No person shall serve water to a customer in a restaurant except on the specific request of such customer. It shall be the responsibility of the owner of the restaurant to ensure compliance with this restriction.
- (b) No person shall use water outside for any purpose.
- C. Upon change in the level of water use restriction pursuant to these regulations, notice of the restrictions is effect shall be publishing in the official newspaper of the Village and posted in six public places in the Village, in accordance with Section 105-4 of the Code of the Village/Town of Mount Kisco.

- D. The regulations set forth herein shall supersede any and all regulations heretofore promulgated during the current water emergency and shall remain in effect until the current water emergency is declared no longer to be in effect or until such regulations are modified by me.
- E. Pursuant to Section 105-4 and Section 105-5 of the Code of the Village/Town of Mount Kisco, the violation of any of these regulations is punishable by a fine of not less than \$250.00 nor more than \$1,000.00, or fifteen (15) days imprisonment, or both, or, for corporate offenders, a fine of not less than \$1,000.00 nor more than \$2,500.00
