- 10 • The Police Department applied for funding in the amount of \$37,475 from the Edward
11 Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Programs for the purpose of purchasing
12 ballistic shields.
13 • The shields enhance protection during response scenarios.
14 • By motion M2022-121, City Council opened the 30-day Governing Body Review on
15 August 9, 2022 as required. That review period has now expired.
16 • City Council held a public hearing on September 27, 2022 as required by the Grantor.
17 • This resolution confirms the completion of the Governing Body Review Requirement

WHEREAS, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program allows units of local government to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime based on their own local needs and conditions;

WHEREAS, grant funds can be used for local initiatives, technical assistance training personnel, equipment, supplies, contractual support, and information systems for criminal justice; including any one or more of the following program areas: 1) law enforcement programs; 2) prosecution and court programs; 3) prevention and education programs; 4) corrections and community corrections programs; 5) drug treatment and enforcement programs; 6) planning, evaluation, and technology improvement programs; 7) crime victim and witness programs (other than compensation) and 8) mental health programs and related law enforcement and corrections programs;

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2022, City Council adopted its Motion M2022-121 authorizing the City Manager or his designee to apply to the Bureau of Justice Assistance requesting funding (\$37,475) from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant for the purpose of purchasing ballistic shields to enhance protection during response scenarios, to acknowledge receipt of the application for the purpose of Governing Body Review that will be filed in the Office of the City Clerk where it will be available for a 30-day period;

WHEREAS, the 30-day period established for Governing Body Review has now expired;

WHEREAS, City Council held a public hearing for the purpose of Governing Body Review on September 27, 2022, 9 a.m. in the courtroom of the Law Enforcement Center at 1101 N. Oak Street;
