RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE RIDE IV COMMITTEE'S 1 R2023-16: RECOMMENDATIONS, INCLUDING THE WIDENING OF 38TH AVENUE 2 3 NORTH BETWEEN ROBERT GRISSOM PARKWAY AND KINGS 4 **HIGHWAY**; **US17** BYPASS/ROBERT GRISSOM **PARKWAY** INTERCHANGE IMPROVEMENTS; AND IMPROVEMENTS TO SEABOARD 5 STREET BETWEEN MR. JOE WHITE AND US 501 INCLUDING 6 7 MULTIMODAL FACILITIES BETWEEN THE INTERSECTIONS OF MR. JOE WHITE AND OAK FOREST LANE; AND TO RECOMMEND THE 8 APPOINTMENT OF CECIL PATRICK TO REPRESENT THE CITY ON THE 9 RIDE IV SALES TAX COMMISSION. 10

<u>Applicant/Purpose:</u> Staff /to endorse RIDE IV's recommendations & appoint Cecil Patrick to the Ride IV Sales Tax Commission.

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## Brief:

- Horry County has collected & invested nearly \$1 billion for road improvements through RIDE's I, II, & III.
- In 2024 voters will vote on RIDE IV.
- It is estimated RIDE IV will generate \$887 million for additional projects.
- ~ 40% (\$355 million) of the estimated total is generated in the City.
- The City has 1 appointment to the RIDE IV Sales Tax Commission.
- The Sales Tax Commission will approve the list of construction projects to be built in RIDE IV.

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## Issues:

The following projects are under consideration in RIDE IV:

- Widening of 38<sup>th</sup> Ave., North between Robert Grissom Parkway and Kings Highway (including multi-modal facilities)
- o US 17 Bypass/Robert Grissom Parkway interchange improvements
- Seaboard Street improvements between Mr. Joe White and US 501, including multimodal improvements between the intersections of Mr. Joe White and Oak Forest Lane
- Resurfacing of a prorated portion of existing paved roads within the City of Myrtle Beach
- This realignment will be a great benefit to residents & visitors of the city.
- Estimated project costs is \$96.0 million, excluding the pro rata share of road paving funding.
- The City wishes to appoint Cecil Patrick to the Sales Tax Commission

WHEREAS, Horry County has collected and invested nearly \$1 billion for road improvements through the RIDE I, RIDE II, and RIDE III capital improvement sales taxes, including such projects as SC 31 (Carolina Bays Parkway) the flyover interchange at US 17 and Farrow Parkway, the re-alignment of US 501, and the extension of Fred Nash Blvd; and

WHEREAS, Planning is well underway for RIDE IV, which will generate an estimated \$887 million for additional road construction and improvement projects, once voters approve the additional one-cent capital projects sales tax in 2024; and

WHEREAS, The RIDE IV Advisory Committee, through considerable deliberation and effort, developed a list of recommended transportation projects, including several which are of interest to Myrtle Beach and will directly benefit city residents and visitors and improve our local transportation network; and

WHEREAS, Among these recommended projects are the widening of 38<sup>th</sup> Ave., North between Robert Grissom Parkway and Kings Highway (including multi-modal facilities); US 17 Bypass/Robert Grissom Parkway interchange improvements, Seaboard Street improvements between Mr. Joe White and US 501, including multimodal improvements between the intersections of Mr. Joe White and Oak Forest Lane, and the resurfacing of a prorated portion of existing paved roads within the City of Myrtle Beach; and

WHEREAS, Based on 2022 receipts, more than 40 percent of the sales tax revenue to pay for all of these county-wide RIDE IV projects is generated within the City of Myrtle Beach; and

WHEREAS, The City of Myrtle Beach has one recommended appointment to the RIDE IV Sales Tax Commission, which will approve the list of construction projects to be built with RIDE IV capital project sales tax proceeds; and

WHEREAS, Cecil Patrick has agreed to serve as the city's appointee to the RIDE IV Sales Tax Commission;
