
Chief's Perspective - 2020

Calls for Service Trend




Department Numbers

Real Time Crime Unit

- Real time crime is a two-person team that completes a heavy workload.
- In 2020, this team testified at 2 homicide trials, both were found guilty
- Participated in several operations that were completed by MBPD
- Monitored the license plate reader initiated over 325 calls for service
- Worked on more than 250 significant cases where video evidence was obtained
- This team consistently is watching the video feed to look for crime in progress, over 1,000 cameras

- They work with road units when crimes are being committed and provide real-time information on crimes such as:
 - Assaults
 - Robberies / Burglaries / Larcenies
 - Stolen vehicles
 - Motor vehicle accidents
 - Missing/Wanted Persons
 - And many more....
