

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO.


WHEREAS, the State of South Carolina has taken, and must continue to take, all necessary and appropriate actions in confronting the unprecedented and evolving public health threat presented by the 2019 Novel Coronavirus ("COVID-19"), cases of which have now been identified and reported in each of the State's forty-six (46) counties; and

WHEREAS, to this end, the undersigned has, inter alia, convened the Public Health Emergency Plan Committee ("PHEPC"); activated the South Carolina Emergency Operations Plan ("Plan"); regularly conferred with state and federal agencies, officials, and experts, to include the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control ("DHEC"), and the South Carolina Emergency Management Division ("EMD"); and requested that the General Assembly take action to make \$45 million from the 2019-2020 Contingency Reserve Fund immediately available to DHEC in coordinating the State's public health response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing, on March 11, 2020, the undersigned issued Executive Order No. 2020-07, suspending certain transportation-related rules and regulations, pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 390.23 and section 56-5-70 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, as amended, for commercial vehicles and operators of commercial vehicles providing direct assistance to supplement state and local efforts and capabilities to protect public health and safety in connection with COVID-19; and



OVERVIEW

Your health and safety are our top priority! Senior staff and the emergency management team for the City of Myrtle Beach are meeting via conference calls to assess and update the situation in light of the reported cases of coronavirus in Horry County. The City of Myrtle Beach initiated OpCon 2 (Operation Conditions 2) on Saturday, March 14, 2020, which elevates our response to a state of emergency for the ongoing coronavirus health threat.

As of April 20. 2020, city personnel continue daily operations. City team members practice social distancing and take the necessary health precautions to ensure a clean and safe work environment. The City of Myrtle Beach has implemented both a hiring freeze and a spending freeze during this emergency period. New personnel positions will be filled if deemed critical to the city's operation. Any new spending is curtailed and must be specifically authorized.

The city looks to state and federal leadership regarding restrictions and guidance, and we are taking the necessary health precautions to make sure that everyone is safe. Please continue to practice safe habits and limit contact with others. Updates to the information below are likely.

FINANCIAL RELIEF FOR CITY RESIDENTS & BUSINESSES

In April 2020, the Myrtle Beach City Council approved three emergency orders designed to provide financial relief to city residents and businesses during the extended coronavirus health emergency.

Water Services... Previously, the city had suspended water service shut-offs for non-payment reasons during the emergency. The new orders waive late fees for utility bill payments. Call 843-918-1212 or email mbutiloav@cityofmvrtlebeach.com for information.

Recreation Services... The order also grants extensions for recreation center memberships due to the recreation centers' closures.

Hospitality and Accommodations Fees... For businesses, the new orders walve late fees for payments of Hospitality or Accommodations Fees or taxes. The payments due on April 20 and May 20 can be submitted without late penalities on or before June 20, 2020. Call 843-918-1200 or email busic(schydmytchesch.com for information.

Business Licenses... The City of Myrtle Beach will accept business license payments without penalty on or before June 30, 2020. Business license renewals and payments are due by April 30. However, recognizing the economic impact of COVID-19, City Council has waived any penalty for

Business License **Renewal Date Extended** to June 30th

Our business license renewal date has been extended to June 30th. If a business is requiring assistance for payment of their business license fee, a structured monthly payment plan may be granted. To qualify, the business must first file their renewal between May 1st and June 30th. The length of the payment plan is determined by the date the renewal is filed. Payment plans will expire on August 30, 2020.
