Re: Meeting Schedule and Agendas

1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached. Please note that Monday, February 18, is **NOT** a city holiday. City services and facilities will operate on their regular schedule next week.
2. **The Myrtle Beach experience is the subject of a new video from Spectrum.** City staff and others worked with Spectrum cable producers for two days last fall to create an *In Focus* piece on why Myrtle Beach is such a great place to live and visit. You can view the video online at <https://spectruminfocus.com/section/in-focus/in-focus-shows/2019/02/07/myrtle-beach--sand--surf-and-family-fun>.
3. **A contractor is replacing an older sewer force main beneath Fifth Avenue South, which will require crossing Kings Highway early next week.** The original line was installed in 1973. The new 16-inch sewer line runs 1,650 feet along Fifth Avenue South, from Mitchell Street to Boundary Street. Beginning Monday, Kings Highway traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction for three or four days while the new line is installed underground. Kings Highway will remain open to traffic; other detours, where needed, will be posted.
4. **The Palmetto Regional FIRST Robotics Tournament is coming up Friday and Saturday, March 1-2, at the Myrtle Beach Convention Center.** Horry County high school students are wrapping up their six-week robot building experience. Teams from each school had six weeks to build a working robot from scratch for this year's challenge, *Destination Deep Space*. Looking for a fun volunteer opportunity? Sign up for the Palmetto Regional by visiting <https://www.firstinspires.org/ways-to-help/volunteer>. Go to the "Get Involved" link. *Reporters...* *The robot-building experience would make a great local youth story.*

5. The Myrtle Beach Marathon also returns Saturday, March 2, beginning at 7:00 a.m.

Drivers should allow extra time to get to their destinations, as traffic will be congested during race hours. Please watch for runners and drive with care! Hotels should advise their guests to park west of Ocean Boulevard on Friday, March 1. Vehicles will not easily be able to cross Ocean Boulevard during the race hours on Saturday morning. See the course map at <https://mbmarathon.com/course-maps/>. Remember that US 17 (commonly called “the bypass”) is not part of the marathon course, so use US 17 for north/south travel on Saturday.

- Plan ahead for travel on Saturday, March 2 and allow extra time to get to your destination.
- Avoid the intersections of 21st Avenue North and Grissom Parkway and 29th Avenue North and Grissom Parkway.
- Anticipate heavy congestion in the Grand Dunes Boulevard and Kings Highway area.
- Northbound traffic on Ocean Boulevard is only available for race participants.

Please be patient. Plan to share the road with runners or seek an alternate route.

Allow extra time to get to your destination on race day. Traffic will be congested, especially between 4:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Expect delays on Kings Highway, Ocean Boulevard, Farrow Parkway, Grissom Parkway and various cross-streets...

- **21st Avenue North** – Greens Boulevard to Grissom Parkway (4:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.)
- **Grissom Parkway** – 29th Avenue North to Mr. Joe White Avenue (4:00 to 11:00 a.m.)
- **Mr. Joe White Avenue** – Grissom Parkway to Kings Highway (6:00 to 11:00 a.m.)
- **Kings Highway** (southbound lanes) – Mr. Joe White Avenue to Farrow Parkway (6:30 to 8:00 a.m.)
- **Farrow Parkway** – Kings Highway to Johnson Street (local traffic to and from The Market Common will have access from US 17, the “bypass,” only) (7:00 to 9:00 a.m.)
- **Pampas Drive** – Mallard Lake Drive to Farrow Parkway (7:00 to 9:00 a.m.)
- **Johnson Avenue** – Farrow Parkway to Nevers Street (7:00 to 9:00 a.m.)
- **Hackler Street** – Johnson Street to Farrow Parkway (7:00 to 9:00 a.m.)

- *For the half marathon...* **Mr. Joe White Avenue** – Ocean Boulevard to Grissom Parkway (6:30 to 10:30 a.m.)
- **Grand Dunes Boulevard** – North Ocean Boulevard to US 17 (8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.)
- **Kings Highway** (southbound curb lane only) – Grand Dunes Boulevard to 65th Avenue North (8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.)
- **65th Avenue North** (westbound lanes) – to Frontage Road and East Coast Greenway (8:30 a.m. to 12:45 p.m.)

- **Frontage Road-East Coast Greenway** – 65th Avenue North to Granddaddy Boulevard (8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.)
 - **Granddaddy Boulevard** – All lanes, then u-turn after three-tenths of a mile (8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.)
 - **Grissom Parkway** (southbound curb lane only) – Granddaddy Boulevard to 21st Avenue North (8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.)
 - **48th Avenue North** – Grissom Parkway to Oleander Street (9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.)
6. **Want to know what events and activities are coming up in Myrtle Beach?** See <http://www.cityofmyrtlebeach.com/Events.pdf>. It's a comprehensive list of city-related activities, festivals, concerts, programs and more, updated weekly with new information.
7. **Online registration continues for City of Myrtle Beach residential parking decals.** See http://www.cityofmyrtlebeach.com/i_want_to/apply_for/resident_parking_decal.php and follow the directions. The parking decals, valid through December 2020, are tied to where the car “lives” and pays taxes. Personal use vehicles which are registered inside the city limits and on which city property taxes have been paid are eligible for the decals. Parking meters return March 1 and remain in place through October 31.
8. **A piece of an early wooden water line, more than 100 years old, is the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** Myrtle Beach Public Works staff found the section of cypress water pipe in 2001, when digging up Kings Highway near Fourth Avenue North. The handmade wooden pipe dates from about 1900, nearly 40 years before the city's incorporation. The wood is four inches square, with a two-and-a-half inch round hole through the middle. The actual pipe is on display at the Public Works Administration Building on Mr. Joe White Avenue.
9. **Did you know...** That the Myrtle Beach Fire Department answered 14,459 calls for service during 2018? Of those, 9,306 were for medical calls (EMS and Rescue), the most common reason. Of the remaining calls, 1,782 were false alarms; 1,566 were service calls; 1,366 were “good intent” calls; and only 253 were for actual fires. The Fire Department also conducted 4,201 inspections in 2018, and firefighters completed 67,337 hours of training.
