10. **Vintage postcards show that Myrtle Beach always was a favorite vacation spot, and that's the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** Local resident Sean Torrens kindly shared a trove of Myrtle Beach postcards picked up while traveling in Pennsylvania. Check out the comments and postmarks, which range from 1932 to 1953. Some images pictured no longer exist, while others are known by different names – such as the Ocean Forest Country Club, better known today as Pine Lakes International Country Club. As one postcard-writer said in her message back home, "We are having a very restful vacation and I think Frank has gained a few pounds. This is a lovely place and the weather has been ideal." Another wrote, "Myrtle Beach is a beautiful place, and the new Washington Park racetrack is gigantic." And another wrote, "Dear Aunt Hazel: Am having a grand time here."
11. **Did you know...** That first golf tournament ever played in Myrtle Beach occurred in 1929 at the Ocean Forest Country Club course (now Pine Lakes International Country Club)? The tournament was held to celebrate the club's first anniversary. Warren Arthur, then-mayor of Hartsville, won the tournament with a round of 64. Former pro baseball star Frank Ellerbe of Latta finished second with a 65. Ellerbe played for the Washington and St. Louis teams.
