3. **City Council approved additional emergency orders this week to provide financial relief for city residents and businesses.** The changes are listed below.

*Water Services...* Previously, the city had suspended water service shut-offs for non-payment reasons during the emergency. The new orders waive late fees for utility bill payments. *Recreation Services...* The order also grants extensions for recreation center memberships due to the recreation centers' closures.

*Hospitality and Accommodations Fees...* For businesses, the new orders waive late fees for payments of Hospitality or Accommodations Fees or taxes. Call 843-918-1200 or email [buslic@cityofmyrtlebeach.com](mailto:buslic@cityofmyrtlebeach.com) for information.

*Business Licenses...* Businesses have an extended period to make business license payments, and those that apply for business license renewals in a timely manner may make monthly payments with no penalty or interest. 7. **The wall of colorful, hand-painted tiles surrounding the playground at Chapin Park is called the Peace Wall, and it's the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** The tiles and wall were created in the early and mid-1990s as part of a global project for peace. Myrtle Beach children decorated the tiles with "peace" as the theme. The history page for the World Wall for Peace can be found at <http://wwfp.org/Pages/history.php>. In the gallery, you'll see links to our wall in Myrtle Beach, as well as a dozen or so others, from Hiroshima to Atlanta and Moscow to Nashville.
8. **Did you know...** That the northern portion of the oceanfront boardwalk, from the 14th Avenue Pier to Plyler Park, is named "Gloria's Way," in honor of Gloria Lindsay Sapp, a longtime teacher, hotelier, volunteer, businesswoman and civic leader in Myrtle Beach? Bronze plaques are in place at either end of this traditional raised wooden boardwalk section to recognize Gloria Sapp, an ardent supporter of the boardwalk project. She died in 2010 at age 84.
