- 1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached.** Note that the Community Appearance Board meeting will be conducted via conference call and streamed live on our [Myrtle Beach City Government](#) Facebook page.
- 2. Need more information about city services or the coronavirus emergency?** You'll find timely updates, FAQs and general information on our [Coronavirus Advisory](#) webpage. Do you have a question about Myrtle Beach during the coronavirus health emergency? Call 843-918-INFO for information about city services, emergency orders and more. The line is available daily, 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- 3. Has your business been closed for a while because of the COVID-19 health emergency?** If so, please remember to let water flow from your faucets for a few minutes to clear out any stale water in the system. Without regular use, the water in your pipes can become stagnant. Let each of the cold water faucets run for a few minutes until you feel the temperature begin to change.
- 4. Drivers, anticipate repaving on 16th Avenue South, between Kings Highway and Yaupon Drive, on Monday and Tuesday, May 4-5.** The road will be closed to all but local traffic while a contractor installs fresh asphalt. Detour signs will be posted.
- 5. Myrtle Beach's Chapin Memorial Library now offers "zero contact" pickup service!** Library patrons can request items by either placing holds online through their account or by calling 843-918-1275. This service is available by appointment, Monday-

Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., while the library is closed to the public. Once your appointment is scheduled, the library staff will provide instructions for “zero contact” pickup. Items cannot be released without making an appointment. We have a 10-item limit per household for this service. For more information, visit <https://www.chapinlibrary.org/>.

- 6. The “Check My Beach” site provides timely information to beachgoers.** With help from the Myrtle Beach Area Chamber of Commerce, the group created a “Check My Beach” website, <https://www.checkmybeach.com/>, for water quality and beach safety information. From rip currents to beach flags to water quality testing, the goal is to provide accurate, up-to-date information directly to beachgoers. The SC Department of Health and Environmental Control routinely tests ocean water quality at more than 120 locations during the swim season, May 1 through October 1. The City of Myrtle Beach also tests water quality weekly.
- 7. Several city rules regarding dogs and bicycles change for the summer season, effective today, May 1.** Dogs are allowed on the beach before 10:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m., May 1 through Labor Day. Dogs and bicycles are allowed on the boardwalk between 5:00 and 10:00 a.m. from May 1 through Labor Day. At all times, dogs must be on a leash that's seven feet long, or shorter. And, humans must pick up and properly dispose of pet droppings!
- 8. The online [E-Resources](#) webpage is available on the city’s website.** City buildings are closed to the public, but we are working to provide online content for all ages. On the webpage, you’ll find creative and educational options for you and your family to enjoy!
- 9. Most activities for the next few weeks have been rescheduled, but we still maintain a comprehensive list on our [Events](#) webpage.** This file of city-related festivals, concerts, programs and more is updated weekly.
- 10. Back in 1942, when Myrtle Beach was home to the US Army Air Field, the city hosted a huge Memorial Day parade, and it’s the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** These historic aerial photos are from May 28, 1942, during World War II. They show a large, military-themed Memorial Day parade along Broadway Street, Main Street, Kings Highway, Ninth Avenue North and Ocean Boulevard. Landmarks to look for include the Methodist Church, the Train Depot, the Chapin Company and the Atlantic Ocean. The Pavilion in the photos is the precursor to the one that most of us recall. (The one we remember was built in 1948; the one shown in these photos burned on December 28, 1944.) The photos show 10th Avenue North, but note that US 501 does not exist yet. Today’s Myrtle Beach City Hall also does not exist yet; it opened in 1949.
- 11. Did you know...** That the City of Myrtle Beach receives approximately 17,000 emails per day, of which about 6,000 are spam or junk? City staff members send another 5,000 to 6,000 emails per day, for a total average volume (inbound and outbound) of nearly 23,000 emails per day. The city has 23 terabytes of email data in storage.
