1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) and agendas are attached.
2. **The Combat Veterans Motorcycle Association (CVMA) and the Military Appreciation Committee invite all veterans to participate in the Veterans March on Memorial Day.** The march begins at 9:00 a.m., Monday, May 28, along Ocean Boulevard, from 16th Avenue North to Ninth Avenue North. The Veterans March includes those who have active duty family members, such as the Blue Star Mothers, while the general public is encouraged to show support for our veterans along the route.
3. **The public is invited to attend the annual Memorial Day Ceremony at 11:00 a.m., Monday, May 28, in Exhibit Hall C at the Myrtle Beach Convention Center.** The ceremony has been moved indoors this year, to avoid the possibility of hot or wet weather. Coastal Carolina University military historian Rod Gragg is the featured speaker. Parking at the Convention Center is complimentary for this event.
4. ***Gumption, Grit and Glory: The Battle of Kings Mountain*, is the title of this year's Memorial Day documentary, to be presented at 2:00 p.m., Monday, May 28.** Veterans and active-duty personnel are the guests of honor at this free showing, to be held at the Grand 14 Cinemas in The Market Common. The event is open to the public, although seating is limited. This is the seventh film in the series by historian Rod Gragg. The documentary tells the story of the Kings Mountain, South Carolina, battle during the Revolutionary War.
5. **Looking ahead to next Friday, June 1, everyone's invited to Plyler Park for the formal dedication of the Goddess of the Sea and the park's recent improvements.** Stay tuned

for more information next week. This event will be part of the kick-off activities for the Sun Fun Festival, which runs Friday through Sunday, June 1-3.
