Re: Meeting Schedule and Agendas

1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached.
2. Now that Tuesday's primary has passed, remember that **Myrtle Beach City Code requires temporary political signs be removed by the candidate or property owner within five days following the election.** Candidates involved in a runoff may leave their signs in place until five days after the runoff. Signs are not allowed on public property, public rights-of-way or utility poles. City staff will pick up illegally placed signs on public property.
3. **On Thursday, June 11, Mayor Bethune extended the COVID-19 Emergency Declaration for the City of Myrtle Beach.** This extension does not close any businesses or impose any travel restrictions. It acknowledges that a health emergency still exists and that precautions are advised to prevent further spread of COVID-19. The extension is based on the rising number of positive COVID-19 cases locally and statewide, the fact that Horry County has been declared a "hotspot" by the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (SCDHEC). The continued need for social distancing and other health and safety measures can prevent the further spread of the illness. The declaration is valid for 30 days unless ended sooner and can be extended again, if needed. Please follow recommendations on health and safety, including social distancing. Again, this declaration does not impose any new restrictions.
4. **With summer day camps for ages five to 12 starting Monday, here are the updated membership hours for Myrtle Beach's recreation centers, which also will open on**

Monday, June 15, 2020. The public hours listed here are only for the weight rooms, cardio rooms and indoor track. Members are limited to 30-minute workouts. Showers are not available, and the swimming pools remain closed for now. Note that Crabtree Memorial Gymnasium will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The longer window (although still not regular hours) is because Crabtree Gym is not one of the summer camp sites. Again, the centers are open to members only during these times. Virtual exercise classes continue through the [City of Myrtle Beach – Parks, Recreation and Sports Tourism](#) YouTube channel.

12. Did you know... That the Myrtle Beach Sports Center recently was voted one of the “Best Indoor Sports Facilities” in the country by readers of *Connect Sports*? The Myrtle Beach Sports Center was ranked among the top four indoor sports facilities nationally, along with centers in California, Minnesota and Iowa. The Myrtle Beach Sports Center opened in March 2015. It has nearly 100,000 square feet of indoor tournament space and can be configured with eight full-size basketball courts or 16 full-size volleyball courts.

Resolution 2020-031 – Resolution to declare the weekends (Friday through Sunday) from Friday June 19, 2020, through Sunday September 6, 2020, as Extraordinary Events.

1st Reading Ordinance 2020-34 to amend 19-178 and 19-180 to:

- **Declare events of any description with an anticipated or actual estimated attendance of more than 10,000 people to be an Extraordinary Event.**
- **Declare the “NOPI” and “Mustang” (and other similar events) to be Extraordinary Events based upon the history of disorderly, unruly and sometimes unlawful behavior, including but not limited to: noise ordinance violations, motor vehicle violations and resulting traffic congestion.**
- **Declare Memorial Day Weekend (Thursday through Monday), July 4th Week (July 2-7) and Labor Day Weekend (Thursday through Monday) as Extraordinary Events.**
- **Delete section 19-178 (e) referencing motorcycle events immediately preceding, and taking place on, Memorial Day.**
- **Authorize the Chief of Police (with the concurrence of the City Manager) to temporarily close businesses when it is necessary to insure the safety of the public. Such action shall be taken only upon the failure of at least one previous effort to achieve compliance, and to be effective only from the moment of such order until that business normally reopens (but no sooner than four hours later).**
- **To authorize the City Manager to impose a curfew in certain areas of the city as necessary to maintain public safety and good order.**

EXECUTIVE SESSION – Council may take action on matters discussed in Executive Session which are deemed to be “emergency” concerns.

NOTE: *South Carolina law requires that Council’s business is conducted in public with limited exceptions, known as “Executive Sessions.” Subjects eligible for Executive Session include:*

- *Personnel matters.*
- *Negotiations concerning proposed contractual arrangements and proposed sale or purchase of property.*
- *The receipt of legal advice relating to:*
 - *A pending, threatened, or potential claim.*
 - *Other matters covered by the attorney-client privilege. Settlement of legal claims, or the position of the city in other adversary situations.*
- *Discussions regarding development of security personnel or devices.*
- *Investigative proceedings regarding allegations of criminal misconduct.*
- *Matters relating to the proposed location, expansion, or provision of services encouraging location or expansion of industries or other businesses.*

Motions to go into Executive Session must be made in public and specify one or more reason above. Council can take no vote or action in Executive Session.
