The South Carolina Department of Insurance is holding a public hearing at 6:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 27, at the Myrtle Beach Train Depot.** The annual property information session and public hearing about the coastal insurance market will help residents prepare for the hurricane season. This is an opportunity to meet with Department of Insurance staff and experts and ask questions. The event is free and open to the public.
- 8. The City of Myrtle Beach celebrated Juneteenth last weekend, and that's the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** The inaugural event on Saturday, June 16, was sponsored by the Neighborhood Services Department in Hayward Park's Garden of Hope on Carver Street. The day featured a celebration of African-American history, education, entertainment, music, food vendors and children's activities. Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration of the abolition of slavery in the United States. Union soldiers landed in Galveston, Texas, on June 19, 1865, with news that slaves were free. The word came two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863. The annual event was named Juneteenth and has become a time of reassurance, reflection and celebration.
