- 10. Did you know...** That the Myrtle Beach Convention Center hosted 192 events during the past fiscal year, with an estimated total attendance of 569,000 people? Conventions, trade shows and conferences make up most of the Convention Center's business. They also generated \$111 million in direct spending locally, including 181,000 hotel room nights. Events geared to a local and regional public audience generated another \$50 million in direct spending for our economy.
