1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached.
2. **Thanks to a lightning strike, Myrtle Beach's Solid Waste Transfer Station is closed to the public until further notice.** Lightning damaged the scale's electronics earlier this week. A repair Wednesday did not last, so the scale at the Transfer Station is out of commission. Without the ability to weigh incoming solid waste, we can't accurately charge customers for disposal. Until repairs are completed, the station on Mr. Joe White Avenue Extension is closed to the public.
3. **The city's Technology Advisory Group hosts another free seminar on Angel Investing from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., Thursday, July 23.** To sign up for the virtual class, see the [Angel Investing 101](#) registration webpage.
4. **The Neighborhood Services Department hosts another Beachside Chat event to discuss race and healing at 6:00 p.m., Sunday, July 26.** The event takes place at Chapin Park, 1410 North Kings Highway. 5. **Will we have South Carolina's Largest Garage Sale later this year?** It's a little too early to say, but the City of Myrtle Beach is closely monitoring the latest COVID-19 numbers and will make a decision in early August about whether to hold the event. The Garage Sale currently is set for Saturday, October 3, which is 11 weeks away. The previously announced vendor registration date of August 4 has been postponed until a decision is made. We hope

that COVID-19 numbers show improvement in coming weeks. We ask that everyone continue to wear a mask and practice healthy habits to stop the spread of COVID-19.

9. **The City of Myrtle Beach officially accepted a park from the Shelley Family on Tuesday, and that's the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** Robert Shelley, a longtime local resident, graciously donated the parkland just south of US 501. A large crowd attended the event, including members of City Council, the extended Shelley family and other local residents. Shelley Park is bounded by Cedar Street, Fourth Avenue North and Balsam Street. The wooded property includes a playground and a bridge over a small stream. Future plans call for expanding the playground and adding a detention pond to serve the neighborhood's stormwater needs.
10. **Did you know...** That Hurl Rock Park on Ocean Boulevard at 20th Avenue South was the city's first oceanfront park? The city acquired Hurl Rock Park in the 1970s. The name originally was Hearl Rock, a family name, but subsequently became Hurl Rock because of the cementitious rock formations at that point on the beach. The formations have been covered by sand for many years.
