**Re: Meeting Schedule and Agendas**

1. Next week's **meeting schedule** and **agendas are attached**. This normally would have been a Planning Commission week, but that meeting has been cancelled. At this time, we do not know whether all of the scheduled Neighborhood Watch meetings will occur.
2. **Speaking of cancellations, the planned concert Monday evening by Vocal Edition to celebrate Constitution Week has been cancelled**. It was to be held at the Myrtle Beach Train Depot. We will look to reschedule such a free event at a later time.
3. **Residential solid waste and recycling collections will resume on Wednesday, with that day's route**. We are skipping Monday's and Tuesday's routes so that our Solid Waste staff can concentrate on cleanup after Hurricane Florence. **HOWEVER, we will pick up the remainder of Tuesday's route on Tuesday. Due to the approaching storm, city crews did not complete Tuesday's route. They will pick up where they left off so that customers do not have to wait another week.** If you have hurricane-related debris, please place it at the curb in a neat pile – but not on top of any utility boxes. Note that we will pick up hurricane debris and bulky junk on a separate schedule for the next couple of weeks, as our knuckleboom trucks will be occupied with other cleanup efforts. Thanks in advance for your patience.
4. **If you no longer need the sandbags that you gathered for Hurricane Florence, we will gladly take them as part of a novel Sandbag Exchange program**. Our neighbors to the west will experience significant flooding in coming days, and they will have great use for sandbags. To join in this effort, just bring your sandbags to the place where we offered free sand last week, adjacent to the City Services Building on North Oak Street. A flatbed trailer

is stationed there; just toss your bags on it, and they'll be available for others to reuse. By the way, credit for the "sandbag exchange" idea goes to local businessman Larry Bond.

- 5. Would you like to serve on a volunteer board, commission or committee for the City of Myrtle Beach?** City Council has one vacancy (Planning Commission) and three term expirations to consider in coming weeks. One seat is expiring on the Beach Advisory Committee and two are expiring on the Seniors Advisory Committee. To be considered for an appointment, submit a letter of interest and a brief biography or resume to the City Clerk, P. O. Box 2468, Myrtle Beach, SC 29578, or bring it to City Hall, 937 Broadway Street, Myrtle Beach, SC 29577.

- 8. Did you know...** That 79 hurricanes or tropical storms have tracked within 75 miles of the City of Myrtle Beach since 1850, including this week's Hurricane Florence? On average, that's one storm about every two years. And the number does not include 1989's Hurricane Hugo, because the center of Hugo passed farther than 75 miles to our south. Hurricane season is June 1 through November 30.
