1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached.
2. **Looking ahead, city offices will be closed Monday and Tuesday, December 24 and 25.** The solid waste collection schedule will shift during the Christmas week. No service will be provided Monday or Tuesday, December 24-25. Zone 1 will be serviced on Wednesday, December 26; Zone 2 will be serviced on Thursday, December 27, and both Zones 3 and 4 will be serviced on Friday, December 28.
3. **Both the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and the Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR) are posted on the city's website.** This is the second year for a Popular Annual Financial Report, which uses plain language to explain the city's financial records for the fiscal year which ended June 30, 2018. 11. **Did you know...** That Myrtle Beach's city-owned structures and their contents are insured for a total of \$298,978,473? The 422 structures – administration buildings, pump stations, water tanks, dune walkovers, dugouts, scoreboards, picnic shelters, storage sheds, static airplanes, recreation centers, the boardwalk, Chapin Memorial Library, etc. – are valued at \$236,658,214, while the building contents are valued at an additional \$62,320,259. These totals do not include the city-owned Sheraton Hotel at the Convention Center, which is insured by the hotel management company. The totals also do not include the value of any underlying land or underground items, such as water and sewer lines.
