2. **City offices and facilities will be closed on Tuesday and Wednesday, December 24-25, to observe the Christmas holiday.** Residential solid waste and recycling will be collected on the following schedule....
 - Zone 1 – Monday, December 23
 - Zone 2 – Tuesday, December 24
 - No collections on Wednesday, December 25.*
 - Zone 3 – Thursday, December 26
 - Zone 4 – Friday, December 27
3. **Pepper Geddings Recreation Center's pool is closed on Monday, December 23, for repairs.** The closure is anticipated to begin at 10:00 a.m. and end at 3:00 p.m.
4. **Business vendor applications are now available for the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration Job Fair, set for 12:00 to 3:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 20, 2020.** The annual event takes place at the Horry Georgetown Technical College Conference Center, 950 Crabtree Lane.
