2. **Make plans to attend Myrtle Beach's Water Safety community event at the Futrell Park splash pad on Saturday, July 20.** Everyone is welcome to join us and learn about water safety, how to stay cool in the heat, swim lessons and more from the Ocean Rescue and Aquatics staff. The Myrtle Beach Fire Department will be on-site handing out free snow cones as the kids play, too. The event is from 12:00 to 2:00 p.m., Saturday, July 20. Free parking is available.
3. **The Neighborhood Services Department hosts "Beachside Chats" at 4:30 p.m., Sunday, July 7, at Cinemark Myrtle Beach, 2100 Coastal Grand Circle.** This special edition of Beachside Chats features "Sound of Hope: The Story of Possum Trot," a heartwarming movie about a small, impoverished community in Possum Trot, Texas, where a remarkable act of generosity and compassion led to the adoption of dozens of children. Admission is \$7.25 for children (one to 11 years old) and senior citizens. Admission is \$10.25 for adults. The City of Myrtle Beach is not responsible for paying admission costs.
4. **Myrtle Beach Fire Department is participating in the Myrtle Beach Pelicans Touch-A-Truck event.** It's set for 6:05 p.m., Friday, July 12, before the Myrtle Beach Pelicans baseball game at Pelicans Ball Park, 1251 21st Avenue North. Fans will have the chance to

observe, visit and ask questions about various big trucks and vehicles. The Pelicans game starts at 7:05 p.m. Don't forget about the fireworks show following the game!

- 5. The City of Myrtle Beach, Coastal Carolina University and Monteith Construction will hold a Groundbreaking Ceremony to begin construction of the Performing Arts Theatre.** The event is set for 10:00 a.m., Monday, July 22, in a portion of the Arts and Innovation District, 811 Main Street. When built, the 300-seat venue will occupy three historic including buildings on Main Street, the former Broadway Movie Theater. Construction costs are estimated at \$22.3 million, with the theatre expected to open in the summer of 2026. The city expects to receive at least \$4.9 million in historical tax credits. Under the lease agreement, CCU will use the theatre for its drama and performing arts programs and will be responsible for operating costs. In return, CCU will have a minimum of 150 "use days" for plays and other performances. CCU also will book 100 days of third-party use, and the city itself will have 30 "use days."
- 6. Both lanes into Mall Drive from eastbound Harrelson Boulevard will close the week of Monday, July 8.** The closure is related to the extension and widening of Fred Nash Boulevard, a Ride 3 project. Drivers can expect the closure to last about a year while Fred Nash Boulevard is extended to Harrelson Boulevard and widened to three lanes, including a center turn lane. The City of Myrtle Beach, Horry County Government, the City of Conway and City of North Myrtle Beach have begun a multi-jurisdictional effort to understand the opioid crisis and its impacts within our community.** In partnership with Health Management Associates (HMA), the municipalities are conducting a community survey to develop an evidence-based, comprehensive Remediation Action Plan. During the data collection phase, gaining feedback and input from key stakeholders in our communities is important to understand what prevention and treatment services are available, what services are needed and what barriers exist to accessibility. CONSENT AGENDA

1st Reading Ordinance 2024-46 to annex ~0.98 acres at 9413 Park St (PIN 394-0304-0030) and to rezone it from Horry County SF 10 (Single Family Residential) to Myrtle Beach R15 (Single Family Residential).

This property is within the Dunes Cove neighborhood. Dunes Cove is zoned R15. The property is currently under Horry County’s jurisdiction and is zoned SF10 (Single Family Residential). The applicant has submitted the proper annexation paperwork. Proposal moves forward w/ the goal of extending city jurisdiction where appropriate. The current site is a fallow piece of land that does not have any habitable structures on it. This lot is 1 of the 10 remaining lots in the Dunes Cove neighborhood that are not within city jurisdiction. Planning Commission recommends approval of annexation & re-zoning (6-0).

Resolution R2024-15 to authorize the temporary obstruction for construction purposes of 1,620 square feet portion of an alley located adjacent to 901 S. Ocean Blvd to Metcon Construction for a construction and staging area for the structure located at 901 S. Ocean Blvd to run from July 15, 2024 through March 15, 2025.

The contractor is requesting to temporarily obstruct 1,620 of an adjacent alley to serve as a construction staging area. The work is scheduled to last eight (8) months, 7/15/2024-3/15/2025. Public use of this portion of the adjacent alley will be temporarily closed/restricted during the construction period. This portion of the alley is planned to be closed/restricted thru 3/15/2025. Contractor is required to return staging area to a condition, which is equivalent to which existed before construction. Contractor agrees to indemnify & hold City harmless from any claims, which may arise from the obstruction in this area. Per ordinance 2006-20, the encroachment fee = \$19,582.50.

REGULAR AGENDA

2nd Reading Ordinance 2024-44 an ordinance to amend Chapter Two, Article 5 Boards, Commissions and Committees of the City of Myrtle Beach Code of Ordinances.

Chapter Two, Article V outlines the duties and responsibilities of the City’s official Boards, Commissions, and Committees. Several of these Boards, Commissions, and Committees are no longer necessary, have not meet in several years, or as in the case of the Technology Advisory Committee, have fulfilled their mission and is no longer needed. This Ordinance and Ordinance

2024-45 are companion ordinances. These Boards, Committees, and Commissions were created by City Ordinance and through the practice of equal dignity these Ordinances also need to be repealed. Ordinance, if passed, would remove:

- Cemetery Advisory Committee (last meeting – 3.21.11)
- Employee Recognition Selection Committee (last meeting – 3.14.16)
- Recreation Committee (last meeting 1.23.20)
- Technology Advisory Group (has fulfilled its purpose, cannot achieve a quorum)
- Tourism Committee (last meeting is unknown. Staff could not find records/minutes)

2nd Reading Ordinance 2024-45 an ordinance to repeal Ordinance 951010-51 (Tourism Committee), Ordinance 2006-064 (Recreation Committee), and Ordinances 2018-033 and 2018-039 (Technology Advisory Group).

Chapter Two, Article V outlines the duties and responsibilities of the City's official Boards, Commissions, and Committees. Several of these Boards, Commissions, and Committees are no longer necessary, have not met in several years, or as in the case of the Technology Advisory Committee, have fulfilled their mission, and is no longer needed. Ordinance 2024-44 deletes and removes the Cemetery Advisory Committee, the Employee Recognition Committee, the Recreation Advisory Committee, the Tourism Committee, and the Technology Advisory Group from Chapter Two, Article V of the City Code.

- Ordinance 951010-51 established the Tourism Committee in 1995.
- Ordinance 2006-064 established the Recreation Committee in 2006.
- Ordinances 2018-033, and 2018-039 established the Technology Advisory Group in 2018.
- Staff was unable to locate any ordinances or resolutions establishing the employee recognition committee or the cemetery advisory committee.

1st Reading Ordinance 2024-47 To amend the 21st Avenue North Ocean Front Planned Unit Development Division 1A (Breakers Resort) to extend the construction schedule.

This request is to allow for more time to complete the construction of Phases 1A, 2, and 3 of the Breakers PUD. Phase 1 of the Breakers PUD has been completed. Phase 1 construction included:

- Construction of the dual brand Courtyard and Springhill Suites,
- A relocated alley way at the end of 21st Ave N, and
- Pedestrian improvements to the alley.

Phase 1A construction includes a new 2 or 3 story MU-H. Phase 2 construction includes a new 230-unit tower and a parking structure. Phase 3 construction includes new mixed-use building/s with restaurant/retail/office and 63 visitor accommodations/residential units. Unless this ordinance is approved, the PUD construction timeline is scheduled to sunset on November 14, 2027. Planning Commission unanimously recommends approval (6-0)

1st Reading Ordinance 2024-48 in the Code of Ordinances for the City of Myrtle Beach, and ordinance to amend Chapter 14, Section 14-62.

Motion M2024-63 to appoint/reappoint one member to the Human Rights Commission.

There is currently one vacancy. On file are the resumes of Crystl Bolie (City Resident), Mikka Rodriguez (Non-Resident), Antonio Cardona (Non-Resident), and James Berry (Non-Resident). This newly appointed term will expire on February 22, 2027.

Motion M2024-64 to appoint/reappoint one member to the Standard Code Board of Adjustments and Appeals.

There is one vacancy that requires to be filled by a Contractor. Adam Singleton (City Resident). This term will expire on April 26, 2028.

Motion M2024-65 to appoint/reappoint two members to the Myrtle Beach Air Base Redevelopment Authority.

The terms of Walt Whittier and Mike Snow expired on June 30, 2024. Both do wish for reappointment. On file are the resumes of Ed Carey (City Resident), Marjorie Thompson (City Resident), and Ann Dunham (City Resident). Both new terms expiration are June 30, 2028.

Motion M2024-66 to declare certain vehicles abandoned or derelict pursuant to the authority of Article 41 of Title 56 South Carolina Code of Laws 2001.

This declaration is an effort to improve the appearance of both commercial and residential neighborhoods. This report includes vehicles staff tagged as abandoned or derelict. Council's approval allows these vehicles to be towed from their private property locations to a tow yard where they may be reclaimed by the current owner upon payment of the applicable towing and storage fees. If the vehicles are not claimed by the owner within 30 days of the required notice, then the tow company may sell the vehicle and keep the proceeds as compensation.

G. Executive Session: The board may take action on items discussed during Executive Session, once the Executive Session ends and the Public Session resumes.

H. Adjournment
