Collins Law Enforcement Center, 1101 North Oak Street. The regular City Council meeting will begin at 10:00 a.m. with the new members. Additional parking will be available at City Hall, 937 Broadway Street, and Myrtle's Market, 605 Mr. Joe White Avenue.
- 2. Attention, City of Myrtle Beach customers, the lobby in the City Services Building, 921 North Oak Street, will soon close for building renovations.** The anticipated closure is January 15-February 12, 2024. Instead of entering the lobby to conduct business, customers will utilize the building's drive-through lane that runs parallel to 10th Avenue North. Questions? - 3. Myrtle Beach drivers may expect a road closure along Fourth Avenue North, between Balsam and Cedar Streets, beginning Monday, January 8.** The work is part of the Arts & Innovation District Project and includes the installation of new box culverts. Plans include the replacement of deteriorating wooden halfpipe with a new skate bowl measuring 50 feet long, 30 feet wide and five feet deep.

Located between Pepper Geddings Recreation Center and Doug Shaw Memorial Stadium, Myrtle Beach's only skate park is named in memory of the late Matthew Reed Hughes, a local skateboarder. ***NOTE:** City laws are known as ordinances. Before a city ordinance can be enacted, it must be introduced (1st Reading) and then approved (2nd Reading). Resolutions are actions through which City Council reinforces or makes policy not rising to the level of law. Motions are related to direction from City Council to city staff to take certain actions.*

CONSENT AGENDA

Motion M2024-001 authorizing the City Manager or his designee to: accept a cash award in the amount of \$417,307 from the South Carolina Public Safety Coordination Council and the South Carolina Department of Public Safety; and, authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute and deliver the agreement and such related

documents as may be required to put the reimbursement grant into effect. No match is required.

The city's reimbursement amount for Fiscal Year 2023 is \$417,307. No match is required, and the city has made outlays for this purpose in excess of the amounts reimbursed by this Body Worn Camera Grant Program.

Motion M2024-002 authorizing the City Manager or his designee to: accept a cash award in the amount of \$46,845 from the South Carolina Public Safety Coordination Council and the South Carolina Department of Public Safety; and, authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute and deliver the agreement and such related documents as may be required to put the reimbursement grant into effect. No match is required.

The city's reimbursement amount for Fiscal Year 2023 is \$46,845. No match is required. The city made outlays for this purpose in excess of the amounts reimbursed by this In-Car Video Camera Grant Program.

Motion M2024-003 to authorize the City Manager or his designee to: accept funding in the amount of \$1,080 from the Chapin Foundation to support the mobile library project; record the appropriation of such funds in the amount that may be approved; and, execute and deliver the grant agreement and such related documents as may be required to put the grant into effect. No match is required.

The Chapin Foundation graciously provided an "anniversary gift" to Chapin Memorial Library in appreciation of their work in the community. The gift will be used to support the mobile library program.

Motion M2024-004 authorizing the City Manager or his designee to: apply for a grant of \$10,000 from American Trails for the Trails Capacity Program Grant program for the purpose of maintaining and improving the A10 Mountain Bike Trail; record the appropriation of such grant funds in the amount that may be approved; and, execute and deliver the grant agreement and such related documents as may be required to put the grant into effect. No match is required.

The Parks, Recreation and Sports Tourism Department will use the grant to purchase materials needed to improve and maintain the trail. The A-10 mountain bike trail is currently a 1.4 mile loop of a twisting, single-track trail. This grant program supports small local trail projects that engage the community and connect trail assets to a broader spectrum of users.

REGULAR AGENDA

1st Reading Ordinance 2024-001 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach to Zvica Elia doing business as USA Resortwear, LLC, located at 1301 South Kings Highway, Myrtle Beach, SC 29577, for the remaining period of the current franchise (February 29, 2024). The agreement includes 20 golf cart decals.

Ordinance 2017-056 approved (01/09/18) the framework of a franchise agreement similar to the system in place for taxis. Ordinance 2023-052 amended Ordinance 2017-056 to allow a

business with a valid franchise to sell its business and transfer its franchise to another buyer. The new buyer must go through the same vetting process by law enforcement, obtain the required insurance, and agree to hold harmless and indemnify the city. This franchise is only valid for the remaining franchise period (02/29/24). This franchise will need to get on the same cycle as the others in March 2024. City Council retains ultimate authority to approve the transfer. In accordance with the proposed Franchise Agreement, a Public Hearing is set for January 23, 2024, assuming this item receives first reading.

1st Reading Ordinance 2024-002 to rezone approximately 6.13 acres (PIN #420-14-01-0053, #420-14-04-0002 and #420-14-04-0003) from MU-M (Mixed Use – Medium Density) to MP (Medical/Professional).

The applicant's property fronts Oleander Drive, between Houndsfield Avenue and 44th Avenue North. The applicant would like the parking for the development to be in front of the building. MU-M does not allow for front-of-building parking. Properties to the north and west are zoned MU-M (Mixed Use – Medium Density), and properties to the south and east are zoned MP (Medical/Professional). Planning Commission unanimously voted to recommend approval (01/02/24).

Resolution R2024-001 to amend the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Budget for Program Year 2021-22 and 2022-23 to reallocate funding for the infrastructure improvement in Census Tract 506 and 507.

CDBG regulations require funds to primarily benefit projects located within the revitalization area. This resolution:

- Transfers \$57,271.51 from Infrastructure Improvements in Program Year 2021-22 to White Street and Acline Avenue projects.*
- Transfers \$71,295.49 from Grey Street Infrastructure Improvements in Program Year 2022-23 to White Street and Acline Avenue projects.*
- Transfers \$15,743 from Infrastructure Improvements in Program Year 2022-23 to White Street and Acline Avenue projects.*

These transfers will allow the city to contract DDC Engineers for professional services, which will include design, HUD environmental assessment, survey and base mapping, and final engineering.

Motion M2024-005 to appoint/reappoint two members to the Chapin Memorial Library Board.

Jill Griffith's term expired on September 12, 2023. She does not wish to be reappointed. Bob Davis, Jr. has also resigned. On file, the city has resumes for Lisa Moniz (non-city resident), Rodger Dicks (non-city resident), and Tina Corley (city resident). The vacant seat's new expiration date will be February 14, 2027. Mr. Davis' seat's expiration will remain February 14, 2025.

Motion M2024-006 to appoint/reappoint one member to the Planning Commission.

Ronald Spencer has resigned. On file, the city has resumes for Betty Anne Mills (city resident), Darcy Coughlan (city resident), Paul Williamson (city resident), Richard Maxey (city resident), Shana Pyle (city resident), and Veena Wulfekuhle (city resident). This seat expires April 13, 2024.

Council elects one member of City Council to serve as Mayor Pro Tem for a two-year term. The Mayor Pro Tem acts as Mayor during his/her absence or disability, and if a vacancy occurs, acts as Mayor until a successor is elected.

Motion M2024-008 to declare certain vehicles abandoned or derelict pursuant to the authority of Article 41 of Title 56 South Carolina Code of Laws 2001.

This declaration is an effort to improve the appearance of both commercial and residential neighborhoods. This report includes vehicles that staff tagged as abandoned or derelict. Council's approval allows these vehicles to be towed from their private property locations to a tow yard where they may be reclaimed by the current owner upon payment of the applicable towing and storage fees. If the vehicles are not claimed by the owner within 30 days of the required notice, then the tow company may sell the vehicle and keep the proceeds as compensation.
