3. **Myrtle Beach voters, Horry County will temporarily combine some precinct locations for the upcoming Presidential Preference Primaries (PPP) in February.** In South Carolina, voters do not register by political party. Instead, registered voters choose to participate in one of two Presidential Preference Primaries. The Democratic Presidential Preference Primary date is February 3 and the Republican Presidential Preference Primary date is February 24. In-city precincts affected include: Coastal Lane #2, Dunes #2, Jet Port #1, Myrtlewood #2, Myrtlewood #3, Ocean Forest #2 and Ocean Forest #3. Photo IDs are required to vote in SC. - 4. At Myrtle Beach’s Warbird Park, work is underway to add new lighting along park pathways, 150 Farrow Parkway, in The Market Common district.** The weeks-long project includes burying power conduits under pathways, adding power lines and installing 20-foot-tall LED flathead lights. A special thank you in advance to Santee Cooper for their forthcoming installation work!
- 5. The Fiscal Year 2023-24 milling and paving projects are in full swing, with various Myrtle Beach roadways receiving a facelift in the coming months.** Drivers, plan for one-lane traffic to accommodate resurfacing efforts and use wayfinding apps to navigate around town. Staff anticipate all projects to be completed by April 2024, weather permitting. - 14. Did you know...** That J. F. Hamilton was Myrtle Beach's first police chief, appointed by the newly-created Town Council in 1938? Until then, Myrtle Beach Farms paid for two police officers (one daytime, one nighttime) to serve the community. Myrtle Beach Farms also built the first jailhouse, near Oak Street and 10th Avenue North. It was replaced in 1951 when the city built a new police station and firehouse on 10th Avenue North. Today, the City Hall Annex Building is home to the Myrtle Beach Housing Authority.
