14. Did you know... That Myrtle Beach Air Force Base's postal address was "General Delivery, Myrtle Beach AFB, SC 29579?" The Post Office was housed in building #230 and mail service was provided by base personnel. Military Postal Service Center hours were 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday-Friday, and 8:30 to 10:30 a.m. on Saturday. Civilian Post Office hours were 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and closed for lunch, holidays, and weekends. Constructed in 1957, the facility was located on Howard Boulevard. No, that's not a typo! A few roadway names were updated after the base's closure in 1993 as part of the site's redevelopment into the modern-day Market Common district. The United States Postal Service now offers locations on the north and south ends of Myrtle Beach city limits: 820 67th Avenue North and 505 North Kings Highway.
