**Resolution R2024-002 endorsing franchise system to regulate rental conveyance businesses and to limit the number of rental conveyances.**

*This resolution reaffirms the franchise system as an effective way to regulate rental conveyance businesses and resolves to limit the number of rental conveyances operating in the public rights of way.*

**Motion M2024-009 to approve an agreement between the City of Myrtle Beach and South Carolina Department of Transportation.**

*This is a financial participation agreement between the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) and the City of Myrtle Beach for the upgrade of the mast arm traffic signal poles at the intersection of Hwy 501 and Third Avenue South in association with an upcoming SCDOT Intersection Improvement Project. The city is financially responsible for the cost difference to upgrade from SCDOT's standard steel poles to the more aesthetically pleasing black powder-coated poles. The city's local share is estimated to be \$101,420. However, the actual value could change based upon the outcome of the future project bid. The city will be responsible for the ongoing maintenance of the mast arms, while the ongoing maintenance of the traffic signal remains the responsibility of the SCDOT.*

**Motion M2024-010 to enter to a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Myrtle Beach Police Department and Summerville Police Department.**

*Law enforcement throughout the state consistently work together to support each other's jurisdictions with special events, investigations and other needs. This two-year agreement will provide mutual aid law enforcement services when requested by either agency, including but not limited to support as defined by manpower, services and equipment in circumstances as needed and as available.*

**Motion M2024-011 authorizing the City Manager or his designee to: apply for a grant of \$455,158 from the Pee Dee Health Care Coalition program for the purpose of extending the acoustic threat detection program throughout the City of Myrtle Beach; record the appropriation of such grant funds in the amount that may be approved; and, execute and deliver the grant agreement and such related documents as may be required to put the grant into effect. The local match of \$30,000 is in the Police Department's operating budget.**

*The funding will be used to extend the acoustic threat detection throughout the City of Myrtle Beach, which is an asset to the Real Time Crime Unit. Acoustic threat detection decreases the threat of gun violence by enhancing the response to incidents of gunfire and improving evidence recovery.*

**REGULAR AGENDA**

**2nd Reading Ordinance 2024-001 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach to Zvica Elia doing business as USA Resortwear, LLC, located at 1301 South Kings Highway, Myrtle Beach, SC 29577, for the remaining period of the current franchise (February 29, 2024). The agreement includes 20 golf cart decals.**



*Ordinance 2017-056 (01/09/2018) approved the framework of a franchise agreement similar to the system in place for taxis. Ordinance 2023-052 amended Ordinance 2017-056 to allow a business with a valid franchise to sell its business and transfer its franchise to another buyer. The new buyer must go through the same vetting process by law enforcement, obtain the required insurance and agree to hold harmless and indemnify the city. This franchise is only valid for the remaining franchise period, 02/29/2024. This franchise will need to get on the same cycle as the other franchises in March 2024. City Council retains ultimate authority to approve the transfer. In accordance with the proposed Franchise Agreement, a public hearing is set for 01/23/2024 if it passes first reading.*

**2nd Reading Ordinance 2024-002 to rezone approximately 6.13 acres (PIN #420-14-01-0053, #420-14-04-0002 and #420-14-04-0003) from MU-M (Mixed Use – Medium Density) to MP (Medical/Professional).**

*The applicant's property fronts Oleander Drive between Houndsfield Avenue and 44th Avenue North. The applicant would like parking for the development to be located in front of the building. MU-M does not allow for front of building parking. Properties to the north and west are zoned MU-M (Mixed Use – Medium Density), and the properties to the south and east are zoned MP (Medical/Professional). On 01/02/2024, Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval (8/0).*

The board may take action on matters discussed in Executive Session which are deemed to be "emergency" concerns upon reconvening in open session.*
