Re: Meeting Schedule and Agendas

1. Next week's [meeting schedule](#) is attached. City Council will hold a special meeting at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, February 28, to interview candidates for the chief municipal court judge position. Agenda is attached. While the meetings will open and close in public, as required by the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act, the interviews will be conducted in executive session.
2. **The Myrtle Beach Boardwalk will receive a facelift in the coming months, with construction beginning Tuesday, March 1.** The Oceanfront Boardwalk and Promenade opened in May 2010 and extends along the oceanfront, from 16th Avenue North to First Avenue South. Refurbishment is expected to extend into the summer months and includes new trash cans and replacement of the wooden decking with a more durable, wood-like material. The boardwalk itself will remain open, with sections being closed as work is completed in phases. The first phase begins near Plyler Park, 1000 North Ocean Boulevard, by Moe Moons, and will move south to Ninth Avenue North. An estimated timeline will be announced based on initial assessments once decking is removed for inspection.
3. **Myrtle Beach's paid parking returns Tuesday, March 1.** New in 2022, a "text to park" feature allows users to text payment for parking for all city spaces. (It was available in 2021 on a trial basis in limited areas.) Directions for the new feature appear on signage and/or meters in public parking areas. Users may also choose to pay at a pay station or meter, or via the Parkmobile phone app. For more information, see our [Parking Meters](#) webpage.

4. **The Myrtle Beach Marathon kicks off at 6:30 a.m., Saturday, March 5, on Grissom Parkway and travels 26.2 miles through the city.** Plan ahead if you must drive during the race, and leave extra time to get to your destination. Be prepared to share the road with runners. Expect congestion and delays between 4:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., especially along Kings Highway, Ocean Boulevard, Farrow Parkway and Grissom Parkway. Use US 17 (the “bypass”) for north/south travel. If possible, avoid the following intersections:
 - Mr. Joe White Avenue and Grissom Parkway
 - 21st Avenue North and Grissom Parkway
 - 29th Avenue North and Grissom Parkway
 - Mr. Joe White Avenue and Oak Street
 - Mr. Joe White Avenue and Kings Highway
5. **The Myrtle Beach Fire Department offers both COVID-19 vaccines and booster shots at weekly clinics.** Staff administer the free vaccinations to registered individuals from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Thursdays at the City Services Building, 921 North Oak Street. 7. **Former students stepped up to save the history of the Myrtle Beach Colored School, and that’s the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** The school served African American students from the 1930s to the early 1950s, before integration. Included in these photos are now-grown students posing at the original building, before it was recreated a block and a half away. Also shown are some early report cards, the girls’ basketball team and a “Tom Thumb” wedding program. You’ll also find a photo of Mary C. Canty, one of the former students who rallied the community to preserve not only the building, but also the history and memories that went with it. - *Matters relating to the proposed location, expansion or provision of services encouraging location or expansion of industries or other businesses.*

Motions to go into Executive Session must be made in public and specify one or more reason above. Council can take no vote or action in Executive Session.
