NON-AGENDA ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC (30 MINUTE TIME LIMIT)

CONSENT AGENDA – *The Consent Agenda covers items anticipated to be routine in nature. Any Council member may ask that an item be moved from the Consent Agenda to the Regular Agenda for lengthier discussion, or a member of the public may request that such an item be moved. Items remaining on the Consent Agenda will be briefly described by staff and may be passed as a group with the approval of the agenda.*

Note: *City laws are known as ordinances. Before a city ordinance can be enacted, it must be introduced (1st Reading) and then approved (2nd Reading). Resolutions are actions through which City Council reinforces or makes policy not rising to the level of law. Motions are related to direction from City Council to city staff to take certain actions.*

Motion M2022-044 to approve a Special Event Permit to Grande Dunes Master Association for the “Dash to the Dunes 5K” on April 23, 2022. The City Manager is

authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

This request includes a closure of a portion of Marina Parkway. The race will be mostly contained to the multipurpose path adjacent to Marina Parkway, with an after party on the marina park field. The applicant is aware that they must pay for any city services.

Motion M2022-045 to approve a Special Event Permit to Michelle Kerscher/Gay Dolphin/Oceanfront Merchants Association for the “Sun Fun Festival” to be held at Plyler Park, beachfront, boardwalk and Ocean Boulevard on May 6-8 2022, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. each day. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The event features a parade on Saturday along with sand castle building, live bands, performers, games, vendors and a Golden Knights appearance. The event will be open to the public with no admission charged.

Motion M2022-046 to accept a grant from the United States Secret Service in the amount of \$3,200 on behalf of the Myrtle Beach Police Department to defray equipment costs associated with the department’s joint efforts as part of the SCEPTF (South Carolina Electronic Crimes Task Force).

The grant defrays the cost of operation, which covers software licensing fees and equipment that were provided after receiving training from the U.S. Secret Service. This year, the MBPD has been awarded this funding to cover the period of October 1, 2022, to September 30, 2023.

REGULAR AGENDA

2nd Reading Ordinance 2022-006 to amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Myrtle Beach, Appendix A zoning section 1305 Awning and Canopy Standards, to add the C7, C8 and Art Districts to the list of districts that allow awnings and canopies to overhang public sidewalks.

The city’s zoning code currently allows awnings and canopies to extend over public rights-of-way in the Amusement (A) and Mixed Use (MU) districts. The Downtown Myrtle Beach Design Guidelines, adopted September 1999, are specific to the downtown area, and provide design solutions and suggestions for rehabilitating the exterior facades of buildings with the use of awnings and other features. At the January 11, 2022, meeting, Myrtle Beach City Council asked staff to explore adding the Arts & Innovation District (ART) and Downtown Commercial District (C7) as zones that allow canopies. The Planning Commission recommends approval (7/0) with an amendment to add the Downtown Commercial District (C8) for consistency. The Downtown Commercial District (C8) is immediately adjacent to the A District.

The following was added to awning canopy standards in the C7, C8 and ART Districts since 1st reading: pay particular attention to lighting the area beneath the awning to maintain consistent brightness along the sidewalk in order to mitigate harsh shadows or dark corners.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-007 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Austin Shelley doing business as Ajax Golf Cart

rentals located at 1307 Nature's Way, North Myrtle Beach, SC, 29582, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 24 golf cart decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 24 golf cart decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 24 decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-008 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to David Stone doing business as Go Fast Motorsports, LLC, Go Fast Scooters, located at 609 South Kings Highway, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 95 golf cart decals and 20 moped decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 50 golf cart decals and 65 moped decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests the same total number of decals, 115, but exchanges 40 decals from mopeds to golf carts, bringing the total to 95 golf cart decals and 20 moped decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-009 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Jack Zakhra doing business as Zeus MB, LLC, Happy Scooter, located at 311 Third Avenue South, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 27 golf cart decals and 36 moped decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 27 golf cart decals and 36 moped decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests same 63 decals, 27 golf cart decals and 36 moped decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-010 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Derrick and Barbara Haynes doing business as Kickback Korner, LLC, Kickback Korner Golf Carts, located at 506 Yaupon Drive, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 20 golf cart decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 20 golf cart decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 20 golf cart decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-011 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Mark Sichitano doing business as Myrtle Beach Golf Carts, located at 408 Third Avenue South, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 205 golf cart decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 165 golf cart decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant is requesting 40 additional golf cart decals, for a total of 205.

Note: Staff does not recommend adding more conveyances to this franchise. While we sympathize with the applicant, we do not see how the city can justify additional decals for this franchisee without also considering requests for additional decals from other franchisees. The purpose of establishing the franchise system was to limit the number of golf cart and moped conveyances on the street with the overall goal of reducing the total number of conveyances over time.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-012 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Ben Robinson doing business as Rent Me Superstore, located at 106 North Kings Highway, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 30 golf cart decals and 10 moped decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 40 golf cart and moped rentals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 40 decals, 30 golf cart decals and 10 moped decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-013 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Ben Robinson doing business as Rent Me Superstore, located at 300 South Ocean Boulevard, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 114 golf cart decals and 83 moped decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 197 golf cart and moped rentals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 197 decals, 114 golf cart decals and 83 moped decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-014 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Ben Robinson doing business as Rent Me Superstore, located at 1205 North Ocean Boulevard, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 46 golf cart decals and 37 moped decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 83 golf cart and moped rentals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 83 decals, 46 golf cart decals and 37 moped decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-015 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to David Stone doing business as Go Fast Motorsports/Savemart Scooters, located at 412 Sixth Avenue North, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 34 golf cart decals and 5 moped decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 20 golf cart decals and 19 moped decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests the same total number of decals, 39, but exchanges 14 decals from mopeds to golf carts, for a total of 34 golf cart decals and 5 moped decals requested.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-016 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to David Stone doing business as Go Fast Motorsports/Sunshine Scooters, located at 713 North Ocean Boulevard, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 30 golf cart decals and 5 moped decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 20 golf cart decals and 15 moped decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests the same total number of decals,

35, but exchanges 10 decals from mopeds to golf carts, for a total of 30 golf cart decals and 5 moped decals requested.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-017 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Bayliss Spivey doing business as KOA Campground located at 613 Fifth Avenue South, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 50 golf cart decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 50 golf cart decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 50 golf cart decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-018 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Ron Simantov doing business as Blue Coral Surf, LLC, Moped USA, located at 1301 South Kings Highway, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 20 golf cart decals.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 20 golf cart decals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 20 golf cart decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-019 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Sarah Yakoel doing business as Gil Scooter/Evry, LLC, located at 109 South Kings Highway, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 20 golf carts.

This company was approved for a franchise agreement covering 20 golf cart rentals in 2021. For 2022, the applicant requests 20 golf cart decals.

1st Reading Ordinance 2022-020 granting a franchise agreement for operation of rental business of conveyances regulated by Chapter 12, Article V of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach, to Jerry Stovall doing business as South Carolina Electric Fleet, located at 97 Broadway Street, Myrtle Beach, SC, 29577, for a period of one year. The agreement includes 4 golf carts and 6 moped decals.

This is a new applicant for 2022. Applicant requests 10 decals, 4 golf cart decals and 6 moped decals.

Note: Staff does not recommend adding more franchisees at this moment in time. The purpose of establishing the franchise system was to limit the number of golf cart and moped conveyances on the street with the overall goal of reducing the total number of conveyances over time. Adding new franchises is counterproductive to this strategy.

Resolution R2022-010 in support of the Ukrainian's sovereignty as an independent nation and condemnation of Russia's military attack and invasion.

This resolution is to support the people of Ukraine.

Motion M2022-047 to approve a Special Events Permit to NS Promotions for The Myrtle Beach Mini Marathon and Coastal 5K, October 15-16, 2022, from 6:00 to 11:00 a.m. on Saturday and 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Sunday. The City Manager is

authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

This is the 13th year for the event and 3,000 are expected to participate. Rolling road closures will occur on each day as indicated on the route maps. The applicant is aware that they will have to pay for any services provided by the City of Myrtle Beach.

Motion M2022-048 to approve a Special Event Permit to Darryl Dayson for “I Love Seafood Festival” at the Burroughs & Chapin Pavilion Place site on September 10-11, 2022, from 3:00 to 11:00 p.m. each day. City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The event will include a cooking competition and live performances. The promoter expects 5,000 people per day to attend.

Motion M2022-049 to appoint/reappoint three members to the Board of Zoning Appeals.

The terms of Robert Shelley, Julian DuRant and Michael J. Schwarz expire on February 22, 2022. All wish to be reappointed. On file, the city has a resume for Geoff Kay (city resident) and Aaron McKnight (city resident) has expressed interest. All terms will expire on February 22, 2025.

Motion M2022-050 to appoint/reappoint two members to the Seniors Advisory Committee.

The terms of Richard Patelunas and Deb Palumbo have expired. Both wish to be reappointed. On file, the city has resumes for Scott Beech (city resident), Lynn Holder (city resident) and Debra Kresch (city resident). These terms will expire on February 9, 2025.

Motion M2022-051 to declare certain vehicles abandoned or derelict pursuant to the authority of Article 41 of Title 56 South Carolina Code of Laws 2001.

This declaration is an effort to improve the appearance of both commercial and residential neighborhoods. This report includes vehicles that staff tagged as abandoned or derelict. Council’s approval allows these vehicles to be towed from their private property locations to a tow yard where they may be reclaimed by the current owner upon payment of the applicable towing and storage fees. If the vehicles are not claimed by the owner within 30 days of the required notice, then the tow company may sell the vehicle and keep the proceeds as compensation.
