8. **Volunteers from Home Depot joined Myrtle Beach city staff members Thursday to build new planting beds for The Garden of Hope, and that's the subject of our [Photos of the Week](#).** The garden box project was made possible thanks to a \$1,000 American Express grant from Home Depot, a \$1,500 donation from Jason Greene of Tuscan Properties and Bradley Development and a \$2,500 contribution match from the City of Myrtle Beach. Crews dug, cut, measured, drilled and hammered to perfect the new box frames. The garden is in the Booker T. Washington neighborhood, between Carver and Dunbar Streets. The Heyward Family provided the land for use as a community garden back in 2016.
9. **Did you know...** That the City of Myrtle Beach tagged 569 abandoned or derelict vehicles on public and private property during calendar year 2021? The vehicles were either inoperable or unregistered. Once tagged, the owner has seven days to remove the vehicle or bring it into compliance (make it operable, with current registration and insurance). The goal is to improve the appearance of commercial and residential neighborhoods by ridding them of such vehicles. Of those tagged last year, 62 vehicles eventually were towed away. Once towed, they may be reclaimed by the owner upon payment of the applicable towing and storage fees. If not claimed within 30 days, the tow company may sell the vehicle and keep the proceeds as compensation.

Motion M2022-052 to approve a Special Event Permit to Lynn Makris/BEI-Beach, LLC, for the Market Common Carriage Rides to be held every Tuesday, from April 1-30, 2022, from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The event includes allowing a horse drawn carriage to carry guest through The Market Common. The promoter is asking permission to close two parking spaces on Howard Avenue in front of Dolce Lusso Salon for carriage pick up and drop off. Expected attendance is 100 per evening.

Motion M2022-053 to approve a Special Event Permit to MMA Creative/Amie Lee for “World Championship Chili Cook Off” at the Burroughs & Chapin Pavilion Place site on September 23-25, 2022, from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day. The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event, and as circumstances dictate.

The event will include more than 220 teams competing in several divisions. The event will also include food trucks, beer and wine sales, live entertainment and a car show. The applicant is requesting the closure of Ocean Boulevard, from Eighth to Ninth Avenues North, each day. The applicant is aware that they must pay for any city services.

Palmetto Event Productions and CCMF, LLC, has planned the seventh annual “Carolina Country Music Festival,” set for for June 9-12, 2022, from 1:00 to 11:30 p.m. at the Burroughs & Chapin Pavilion Place. The 2022 performers include Keith Urban, Luke Bryan, Jason Aldean and other artists. The festival also includes food, beverage and merchandise vendors, and the festival is expected to attract 30,000 concert-goers daily.

The proposed request includes closing a number of streets prior to, and during, the festival. These roads include the following:

- *Ocean Boulevard, between Eighth and Ninth Avenues North*
- *Eighth Avenue North – Includes all lanes and parking spaces from Kings Highway to Ocean Boulevard.*
- *Chester Street, between Seventh and Eighth Avenues North, and parking lanes.*
- *Ninth Avenue North – Includes all lanes and parking spaces from Kings Highway to Ocean Boulevard.*
- *Eighth Avenue North Beach Access*

Per the proposed resolution, City Council:

- *Adopts site plan and authorizes City Manager to make necessary changes.*
- *Authorizes area businesses to display temporary welcome signs.*
- *Per the agreement with CCMF, the promoter will pay the city \$7.00 per ticket to defray the cost of public services. The estimated amount to be collected is \$210,000 (30,000 tickets x \$7 = \$210,000).*
